## Jewish Population in the United States

**T**HE DATA carried in the tables below have not been updated from the previous year.

Preliminary data indicated that few major changes in the larger community population estimates were to be expected. There also were no new estimates from the National United Jewish Appeal for the smaller communities.

It is expected that we will have total and regional estimates for the United States Jewish population in 1971. These will be derived from the national Jewish population study that is being conducted currently under the auspices of the Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds. A thorough revision of the individual community and state estimates will be made next year, using the national estimates as a reference point.

<sup>1</sup> There are five different definitions of urban area in use: 1. *urban place* "includes all places of 2,500 inhabitants or more and the towns, townships, and counties classified as urban"; 2. *central city* is identical with the political boundaries of the incorporated city at the core of an urban area; 3. *urbanized area* includes at least one central city of 50,000 inhabitants or more as well as the closely-settled surrounding area; 4. *standard metropolitan statistical area* includes at least one central city of 50,000 inhabitants or more, together with the county or counties which are economically and otherwise oriented to the central city; 5. *standard consolidated areas* are several contiguous standard metropolitan areas and additional counties that appear to have strong interrelationships: e.g., the New York-Northeastern New Jersey and the Chicago-Northwestern Indiana standard consolidated areas.

The areas covered by the population estimates in Appendix Table 3 do not uniquely fit into any one of these census definitions. The Jewish estimates are based upon the service and campaign areas of Jewish federations, and these show wide variations. Mostly, but with many exceptions, the areas in appended Table 3 would be closest in concept to *urbanized area*. Specific information about the area covered by a particular estimate can often be obtained by writing directly to the appropriate federation.
