


# Percentage of Jews in the total population




# Percentage of all Jewish households that live in the zip code area containing the largest number of Jewish households

# Percentage of all Jewish households that live in the Five zip code area containing the largest number of Jewish households






# Persons in Jewish Households: % Age 18-34














### Adults in Jewish Households: % Born Elsewhere in the United States




### Adults in Jewish Households: % Born Outside the United States




### All Respondents: % Residency in Local Community 0-4 years






### Jewish Households: Average Number of New Households over Past Five Years






#### Jewish Households: % Definitely or Probably Moving in Next Three Years




### Jewish Households: % Definitely Not Moving in Next Three Years

# Households in which the Respondent is Age 50+: % of Adult Children Who Have Established their Own Homes in the Local Community









































### Adults Age 25+ in Jewish Households: % with a High School Degree or Less












## Persons Age 65+ in Jewish Households: % Employed Full Time
















#### Jewish Households Age 65+: Median Household Income (Adjusted for Inflation to 2012 Dollars)














