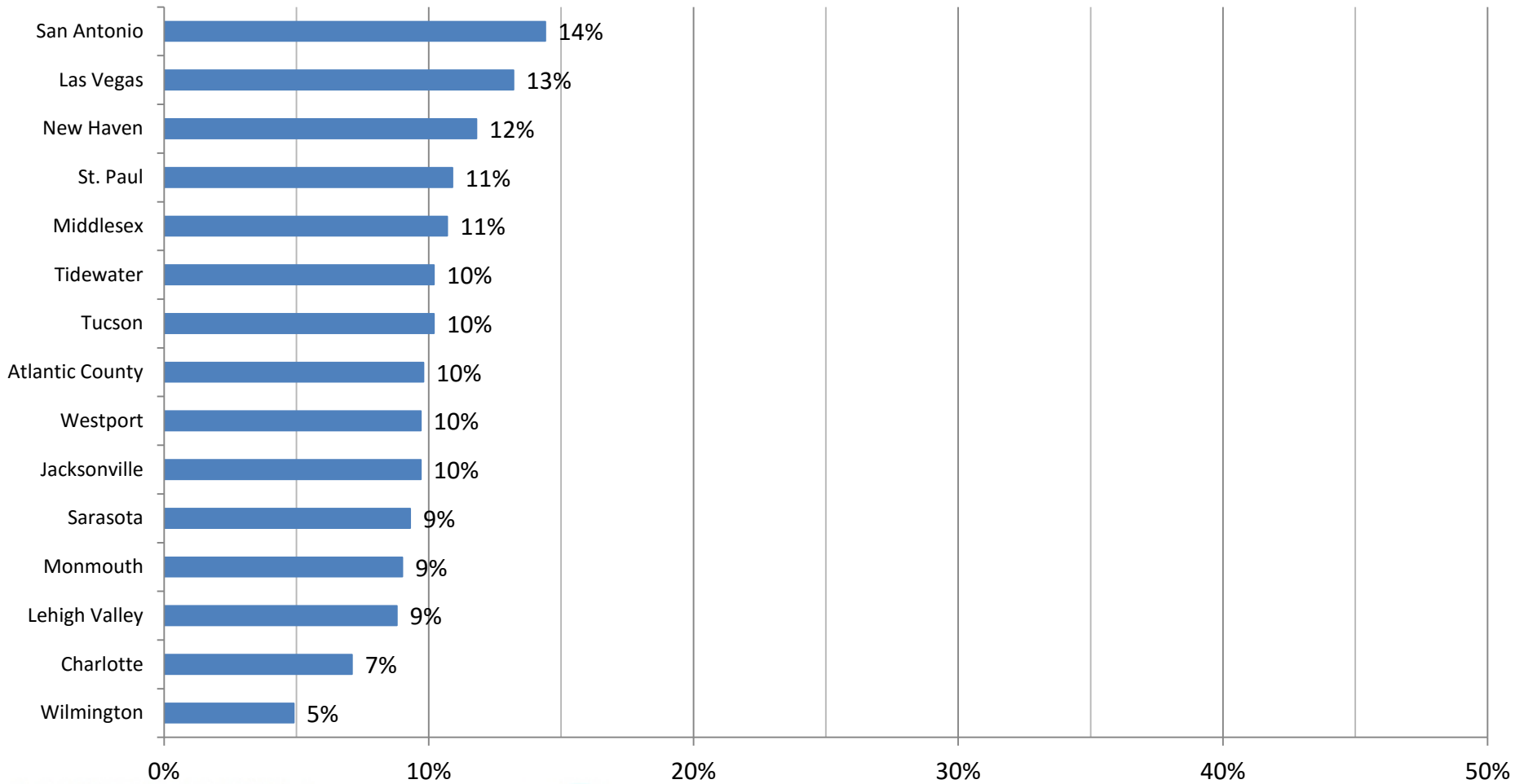

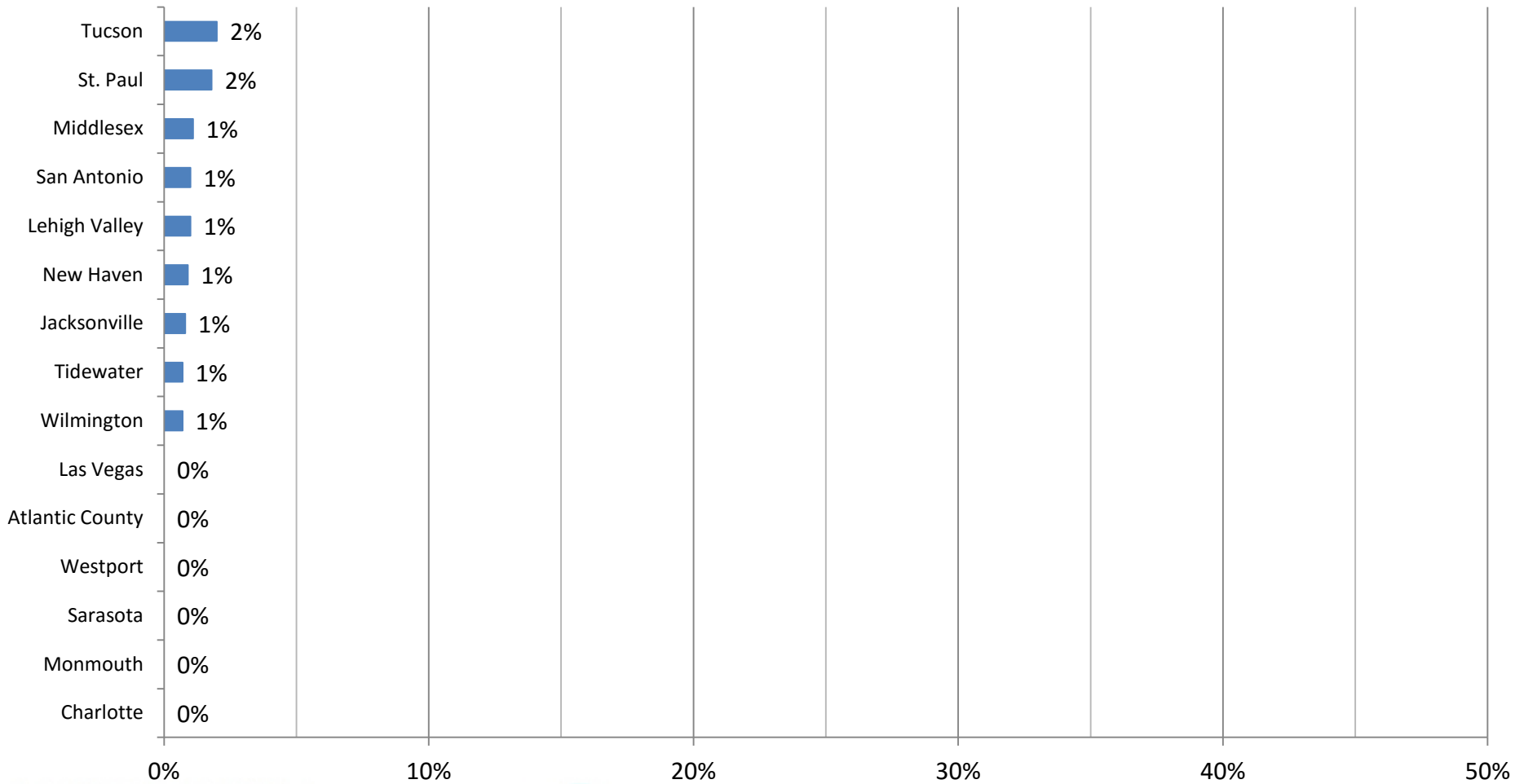

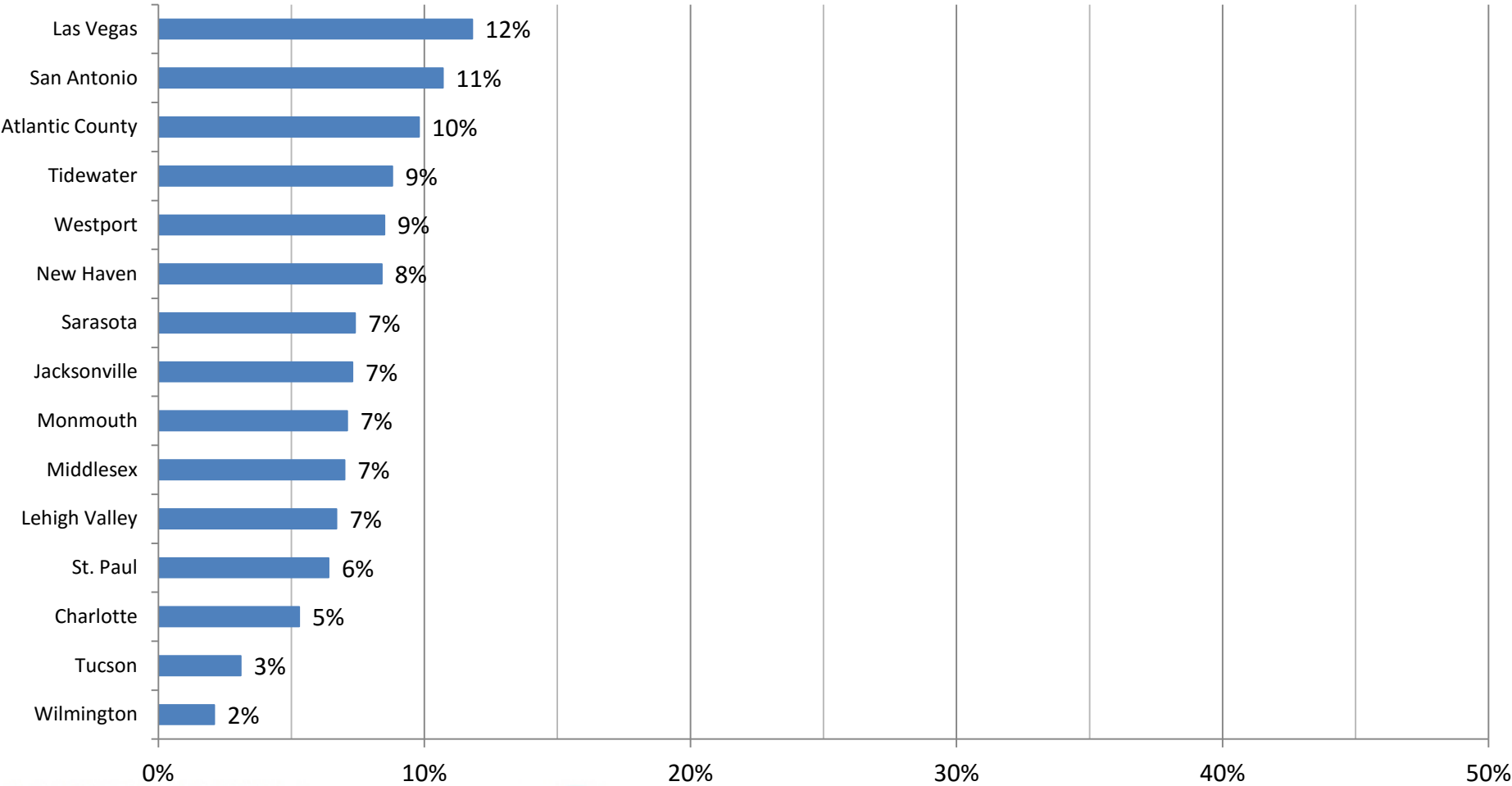
Households with Jewish Children Age 0-17: % Needed Programs for Children with Learning Disabilities in the Past Year



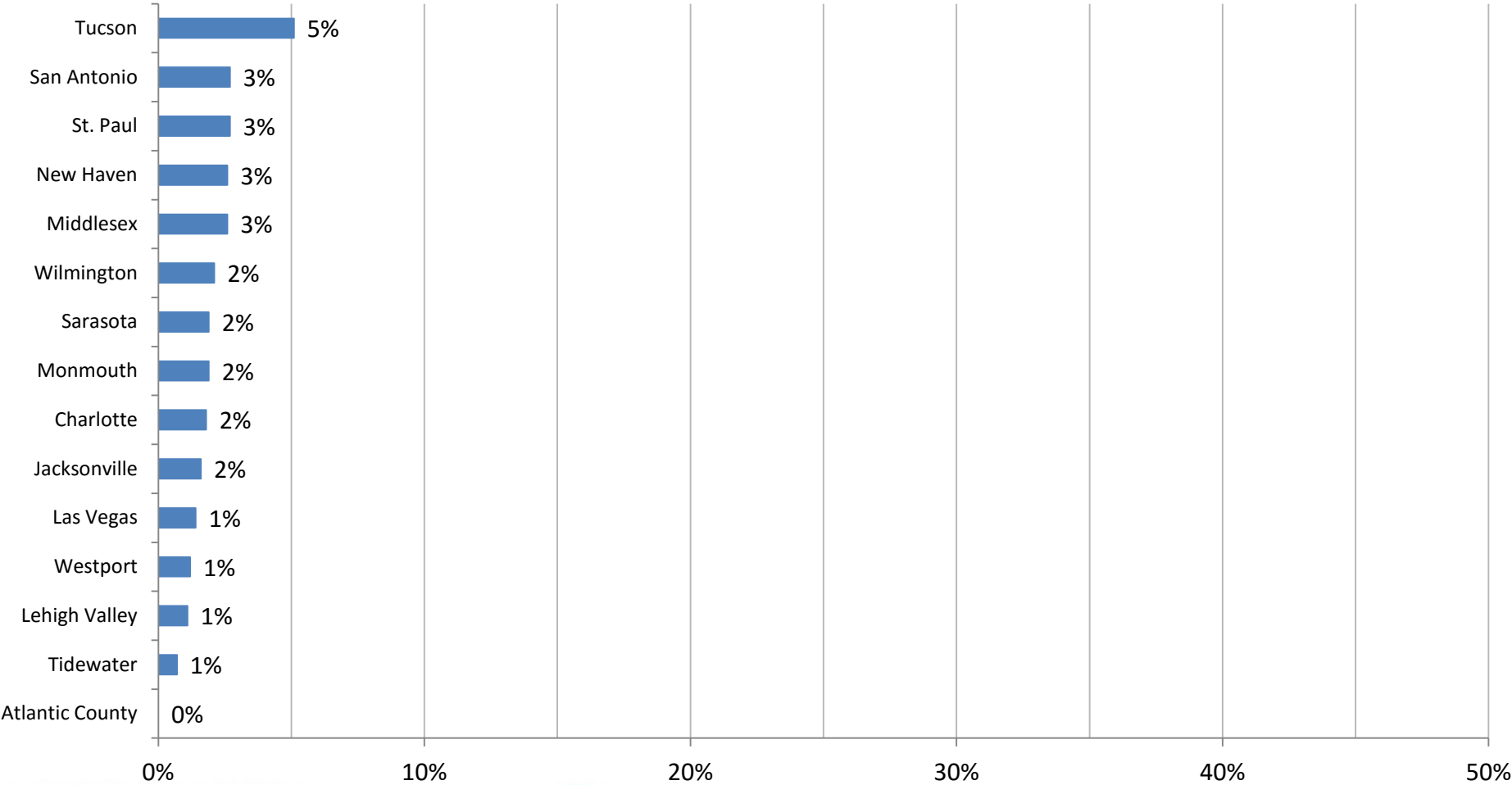
Households with Jewish Children Age 0-17: % Attended Jewish Program for Children with Learning Disabilities in the Past Year



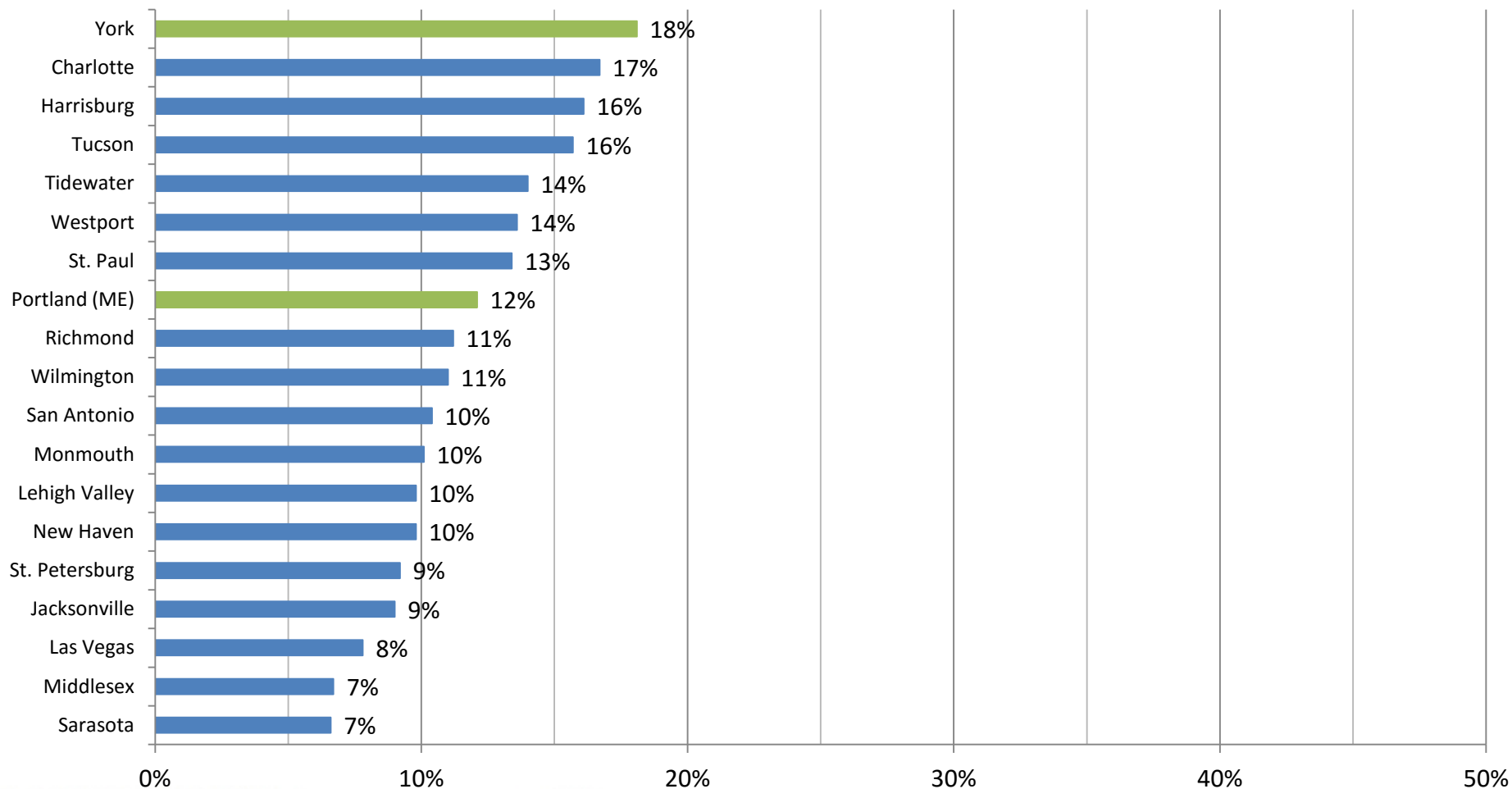
Households with Jewish Children Age 0-17: % Attended Non-Jewish Program for Children with Learning Disabilities in the Past Year



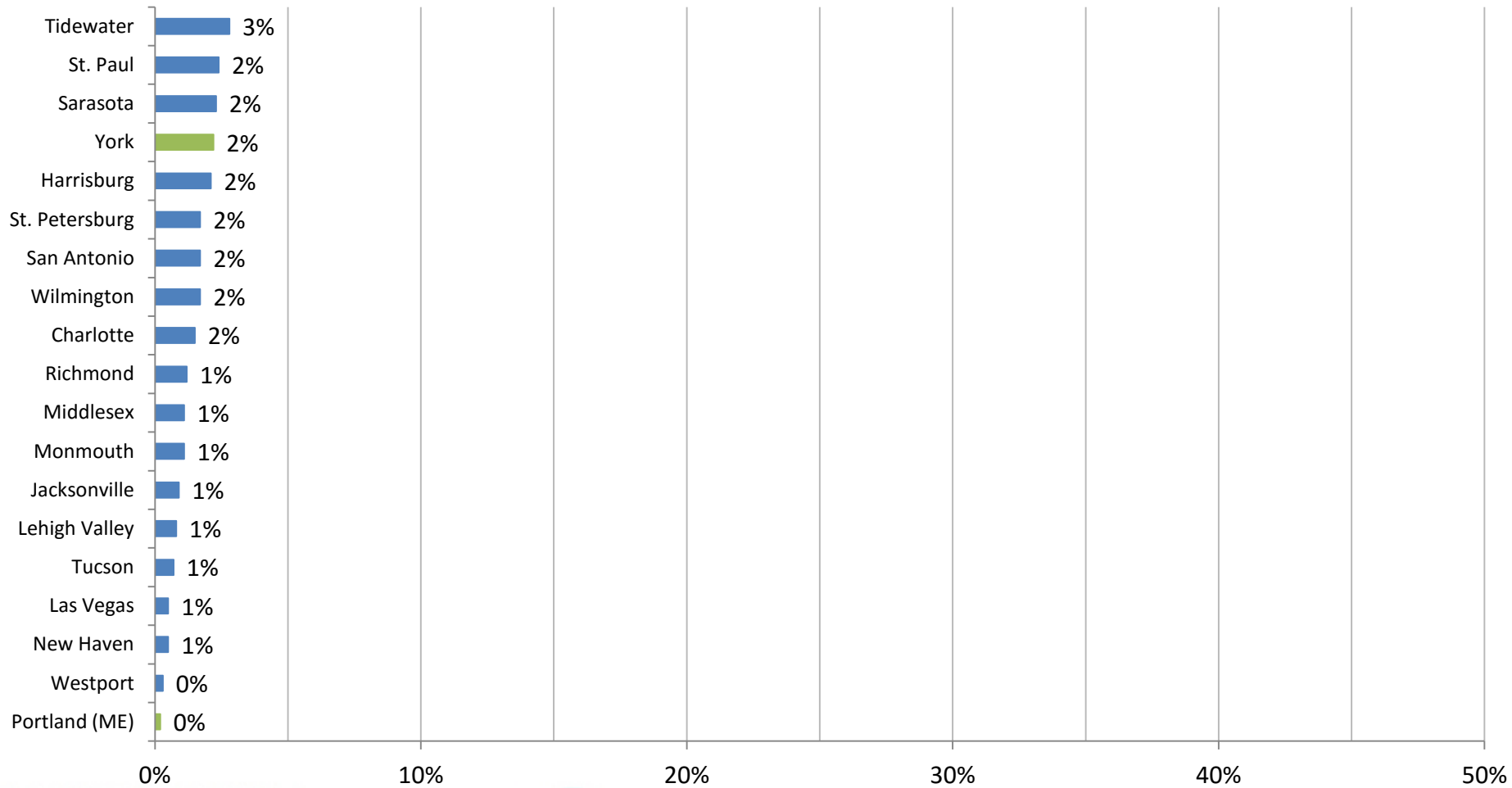
Households with Jewish Children Age 0-17: % Needed but Did Not Attended Program for Children with Learning Disabilities



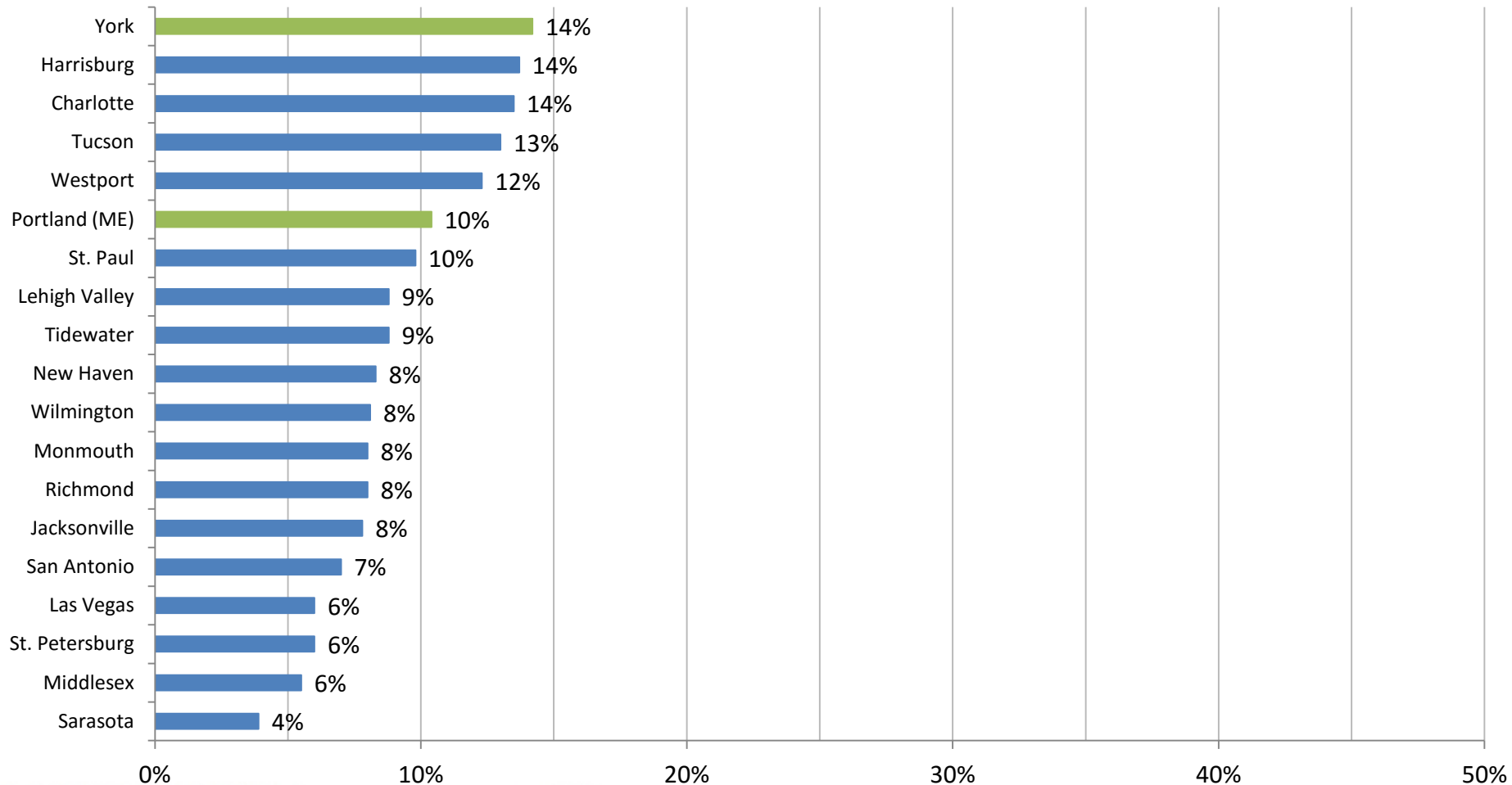
Jewish Households: % Needed Marital, Family, or Personal Counseling in the Past Year



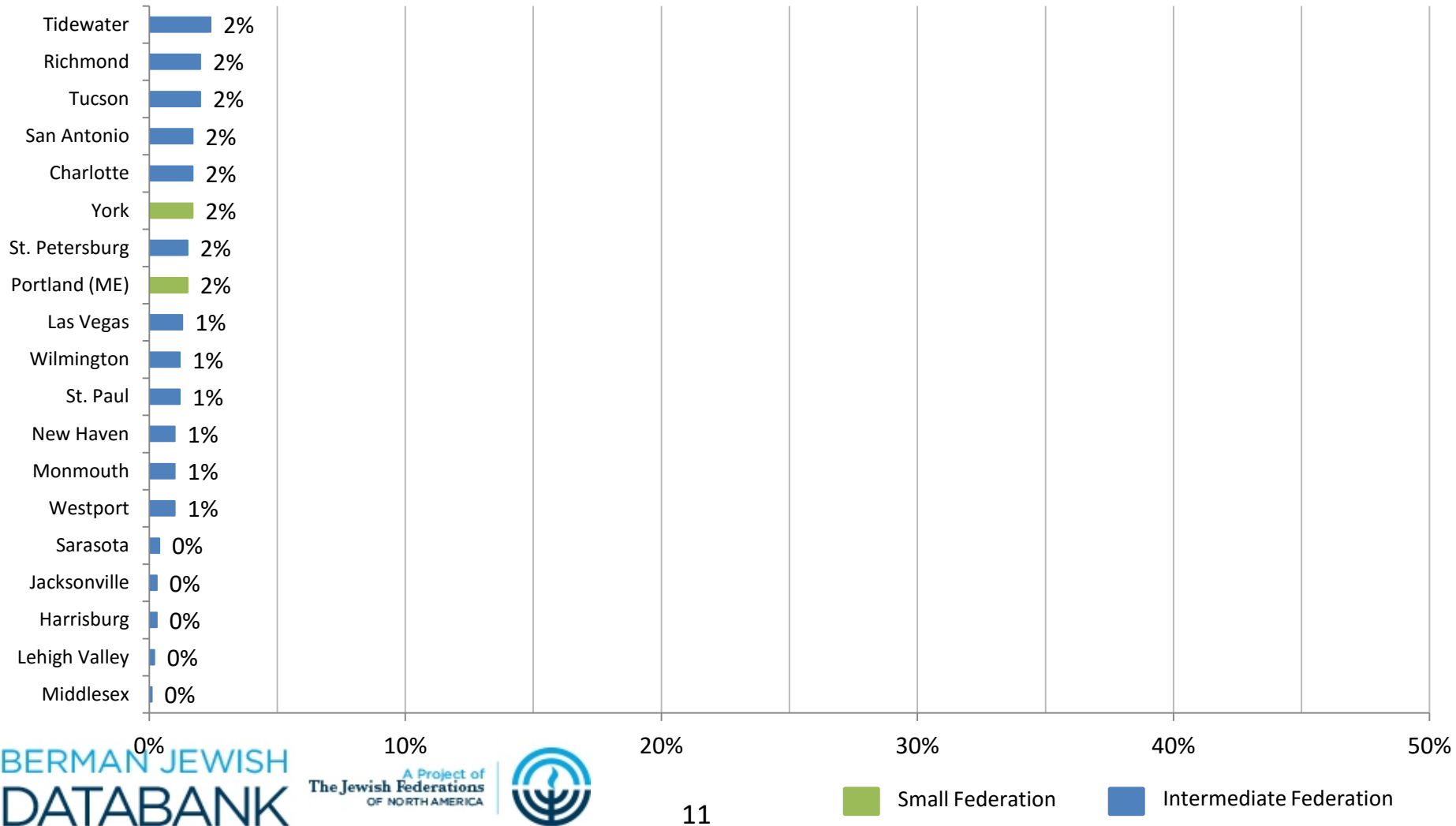
Jewish Households: % Received Jewish Marital, Family, or Personal Counseling in the Past Year



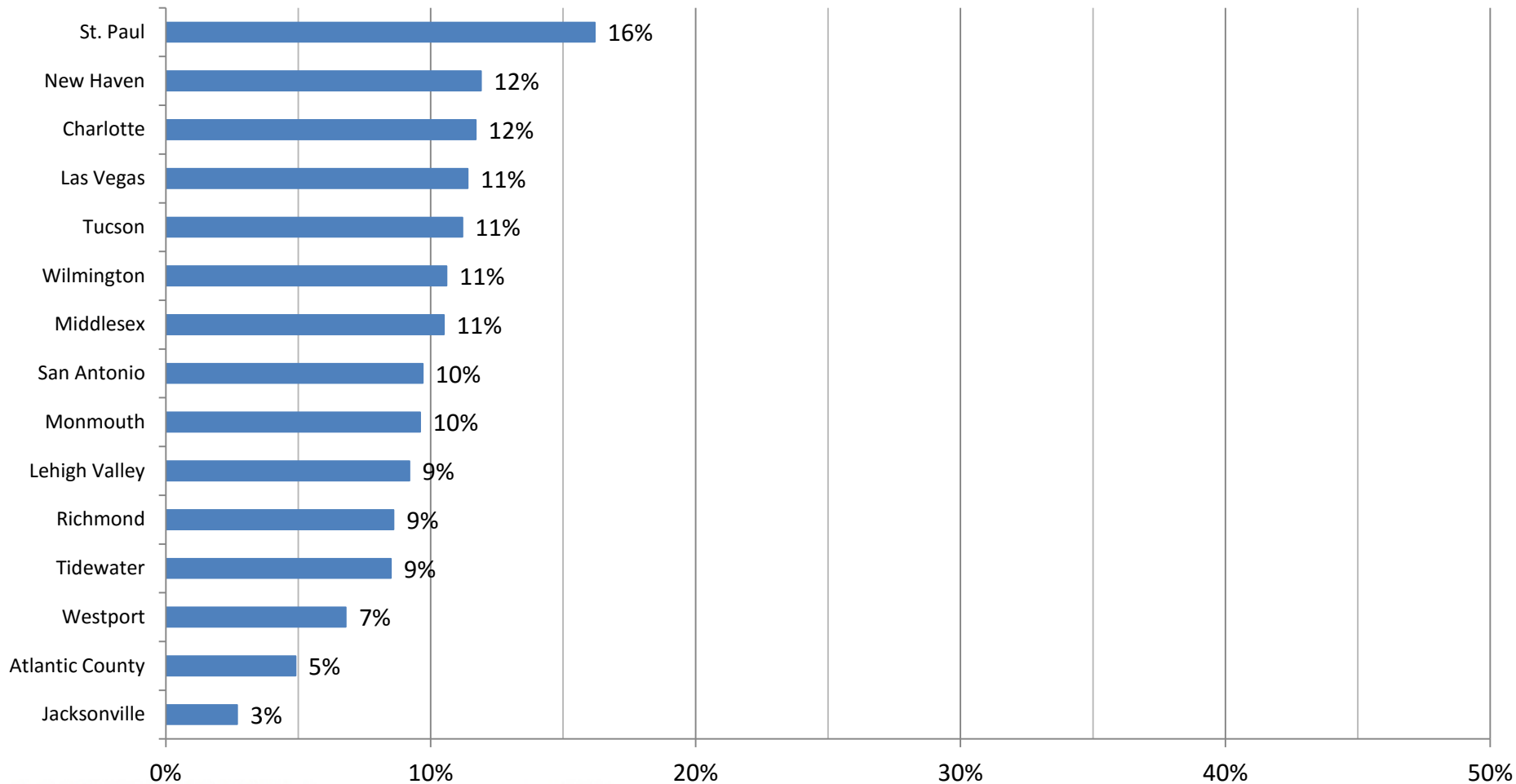
Jewish Households: % Received Non-Jewish Marital, Family, or Personal Counseling in the Past Year



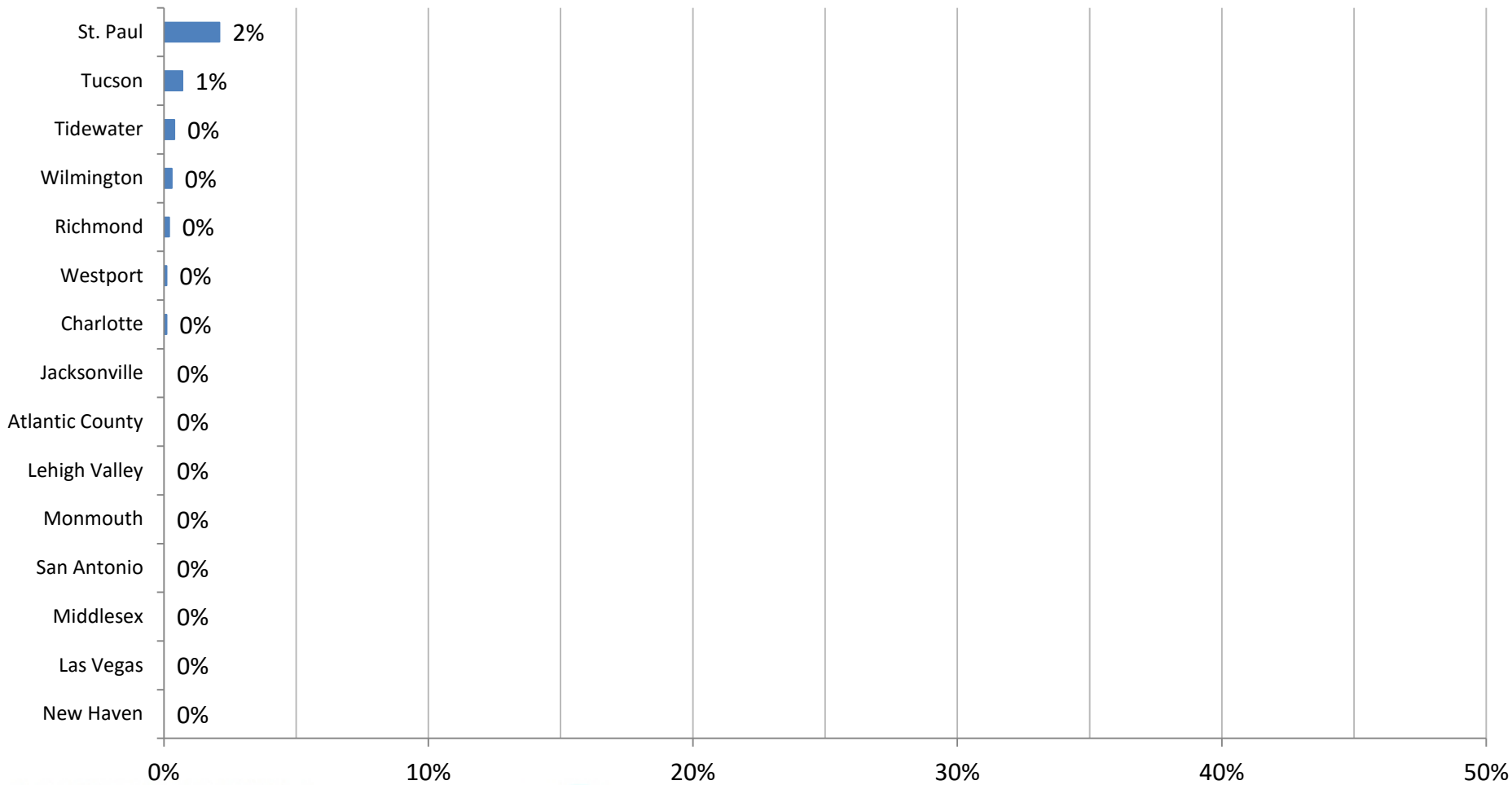
Jewish Households: % Needed but Did Not Receive Marital, Family, or Personal Counseling in the Past Year



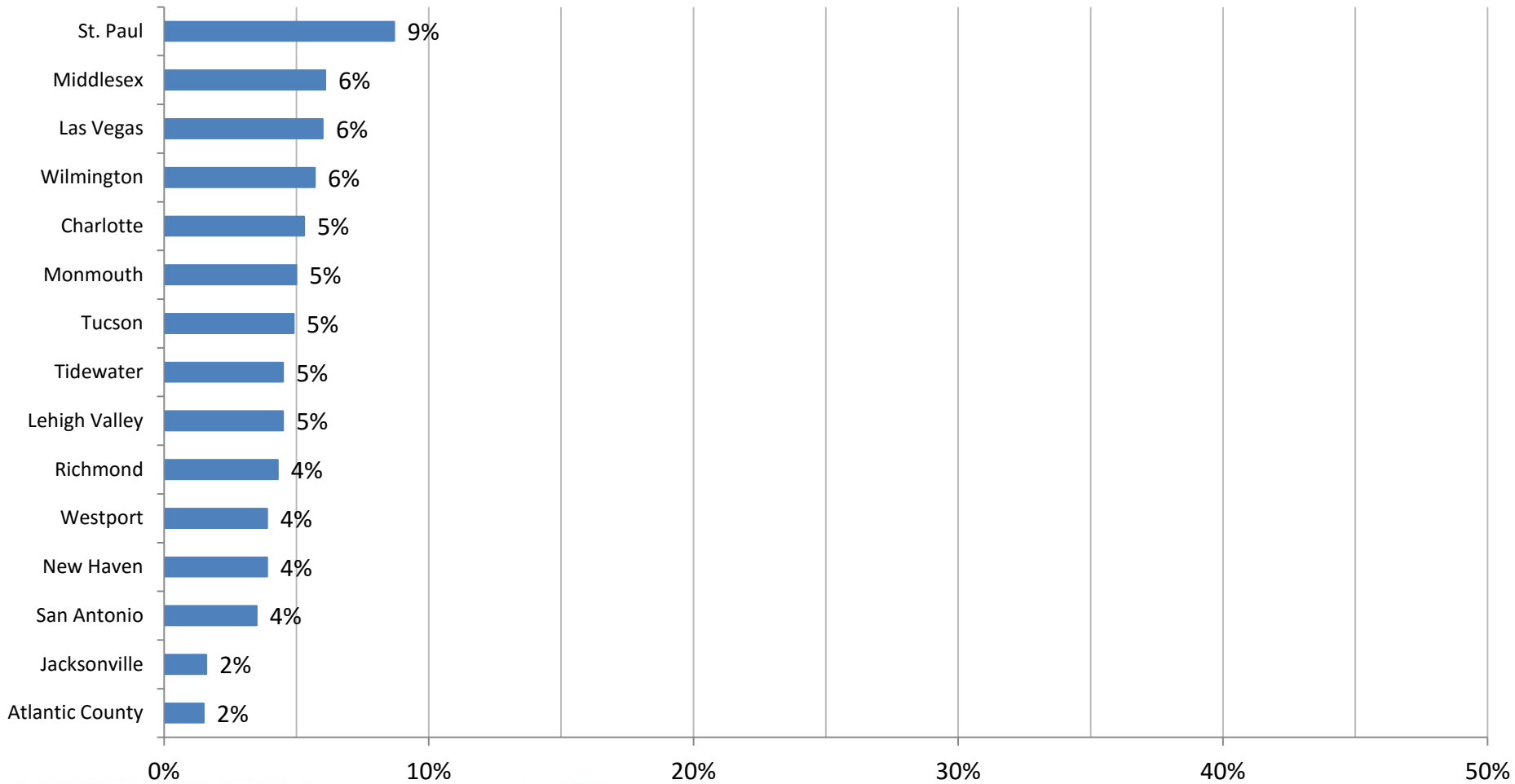
Jewish Households with Adults Age 18-64: % Needed Job Counseling in the Past Year



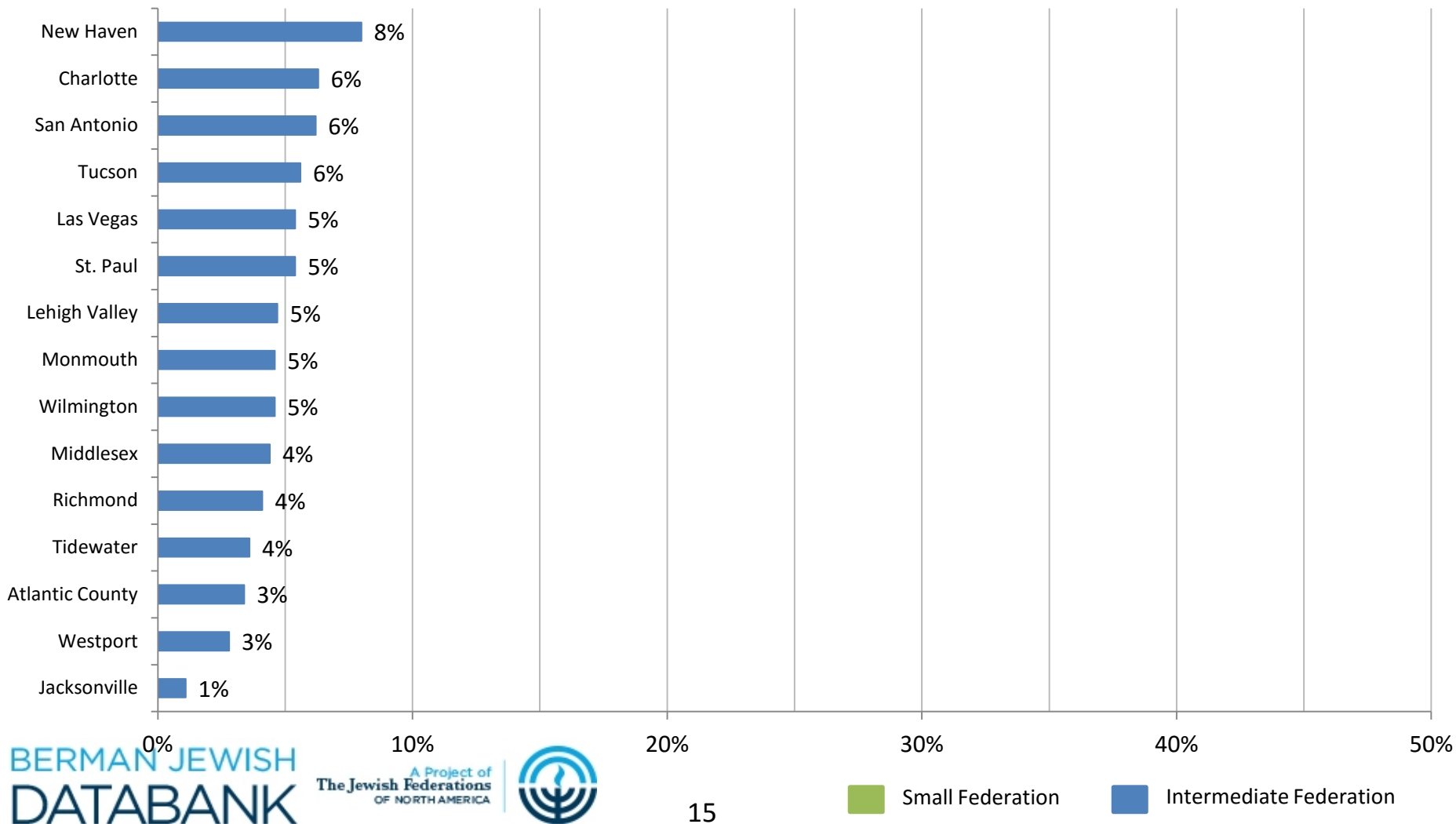
Jewish Households with Adults Age 18-64: % Received Jewish Job Counseling in the Past Year



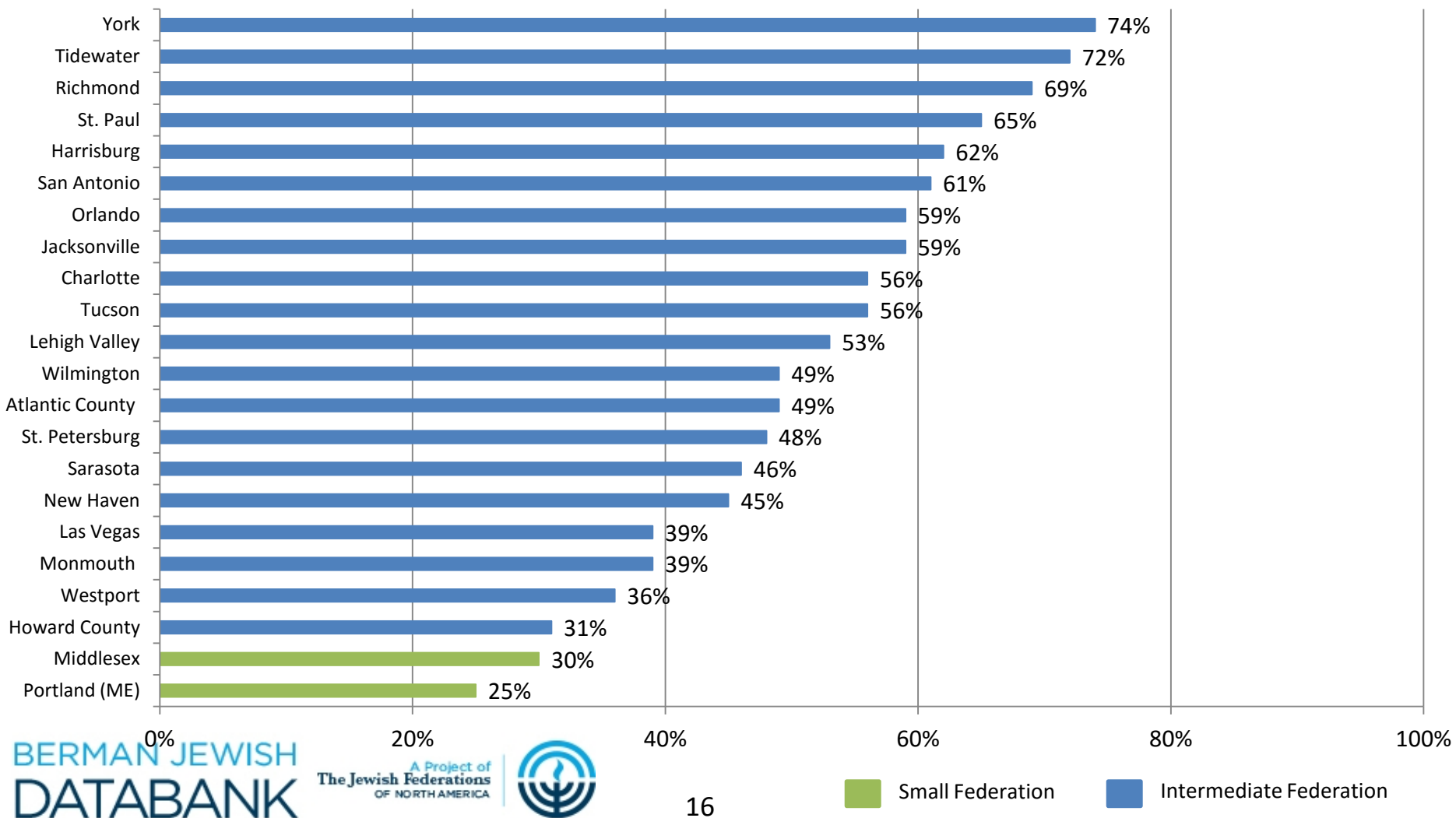
Jewish Households with Adults Age 18-64: % Received Non-Jewish Job Counseling in the Past Year

All Respondents: % Very or Somewhat Familiar with Jewish Family Services

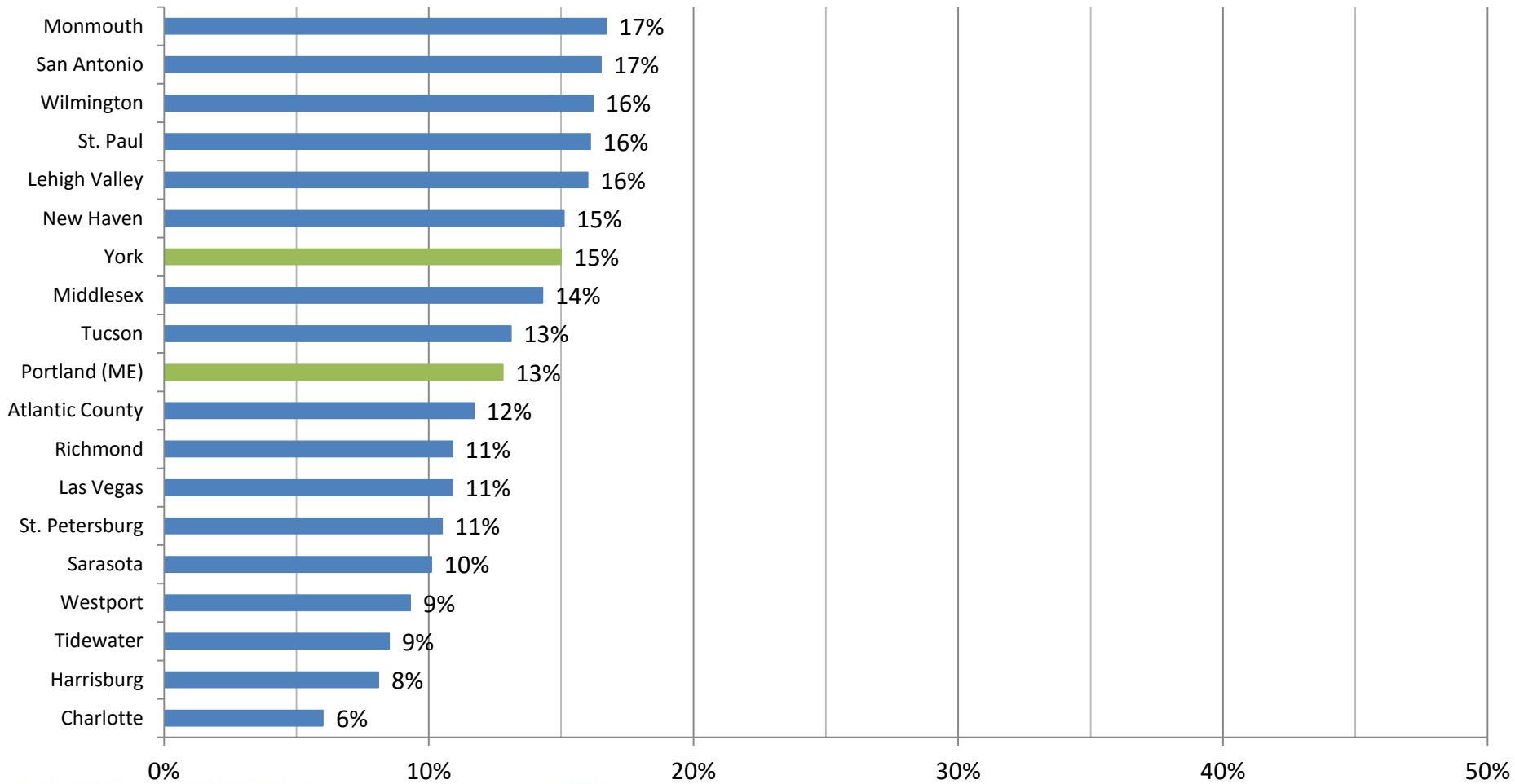

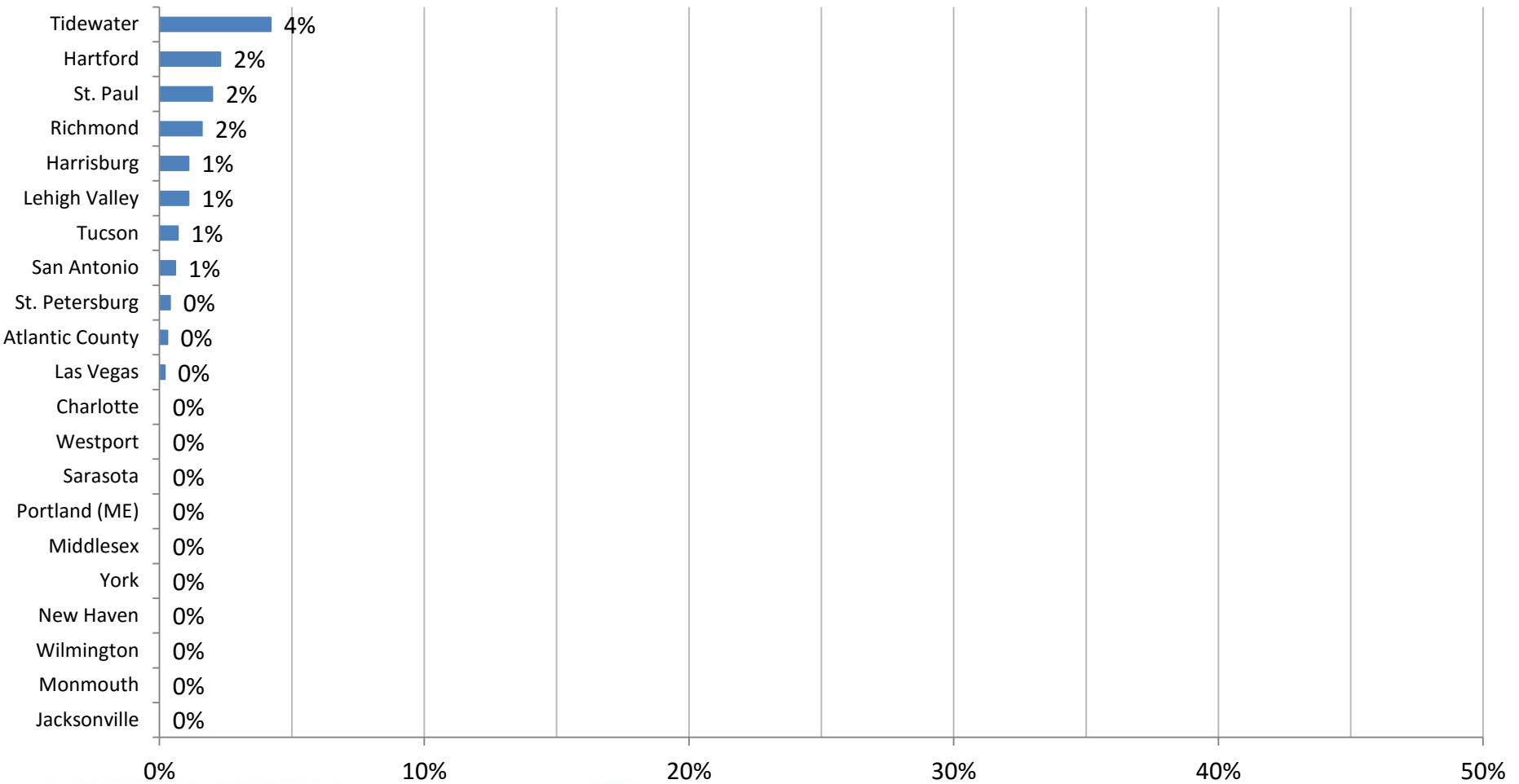

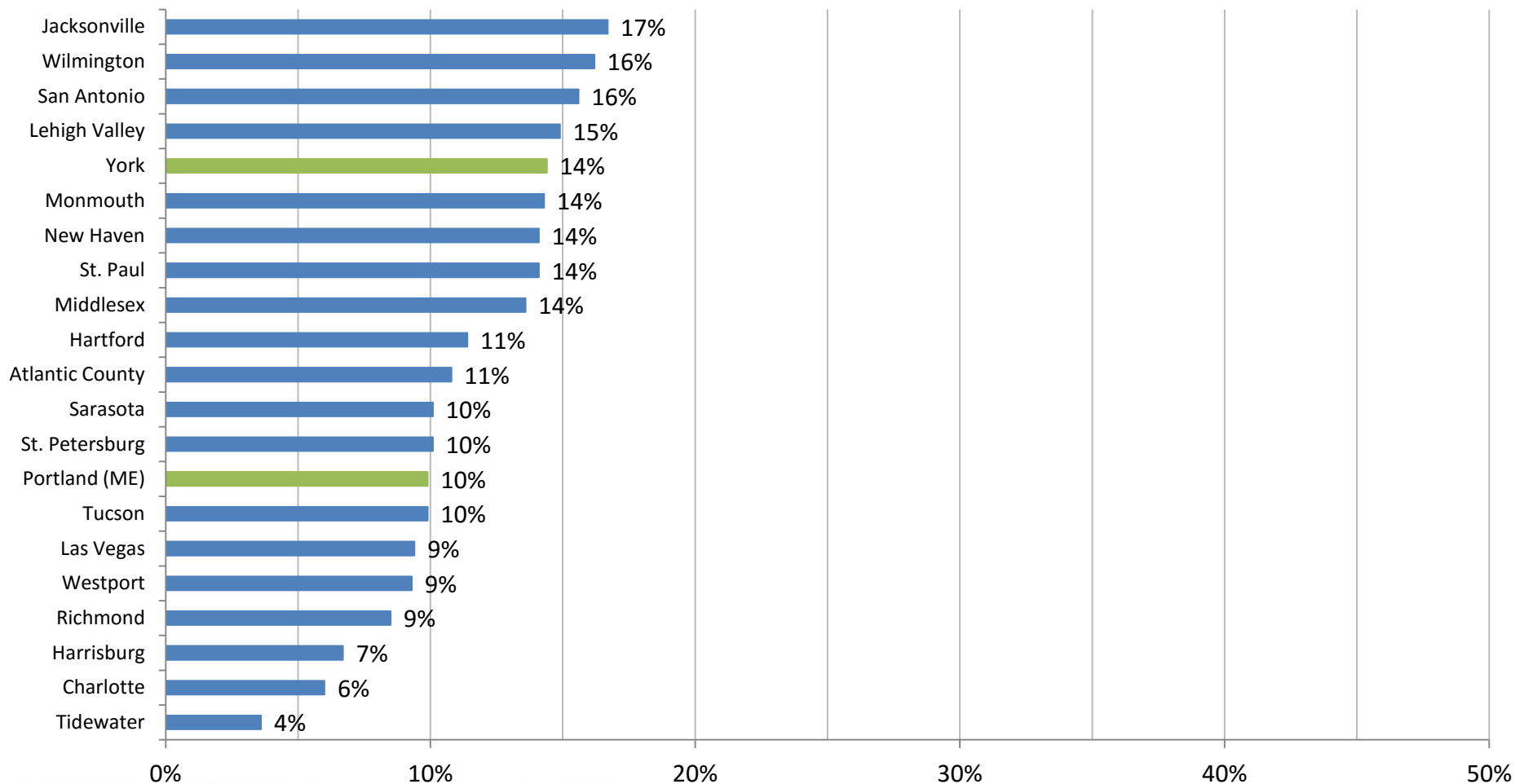
Jewish Households with Persons Age 65+: % Needed In-Home Health Care for the Elderly in the Past Year



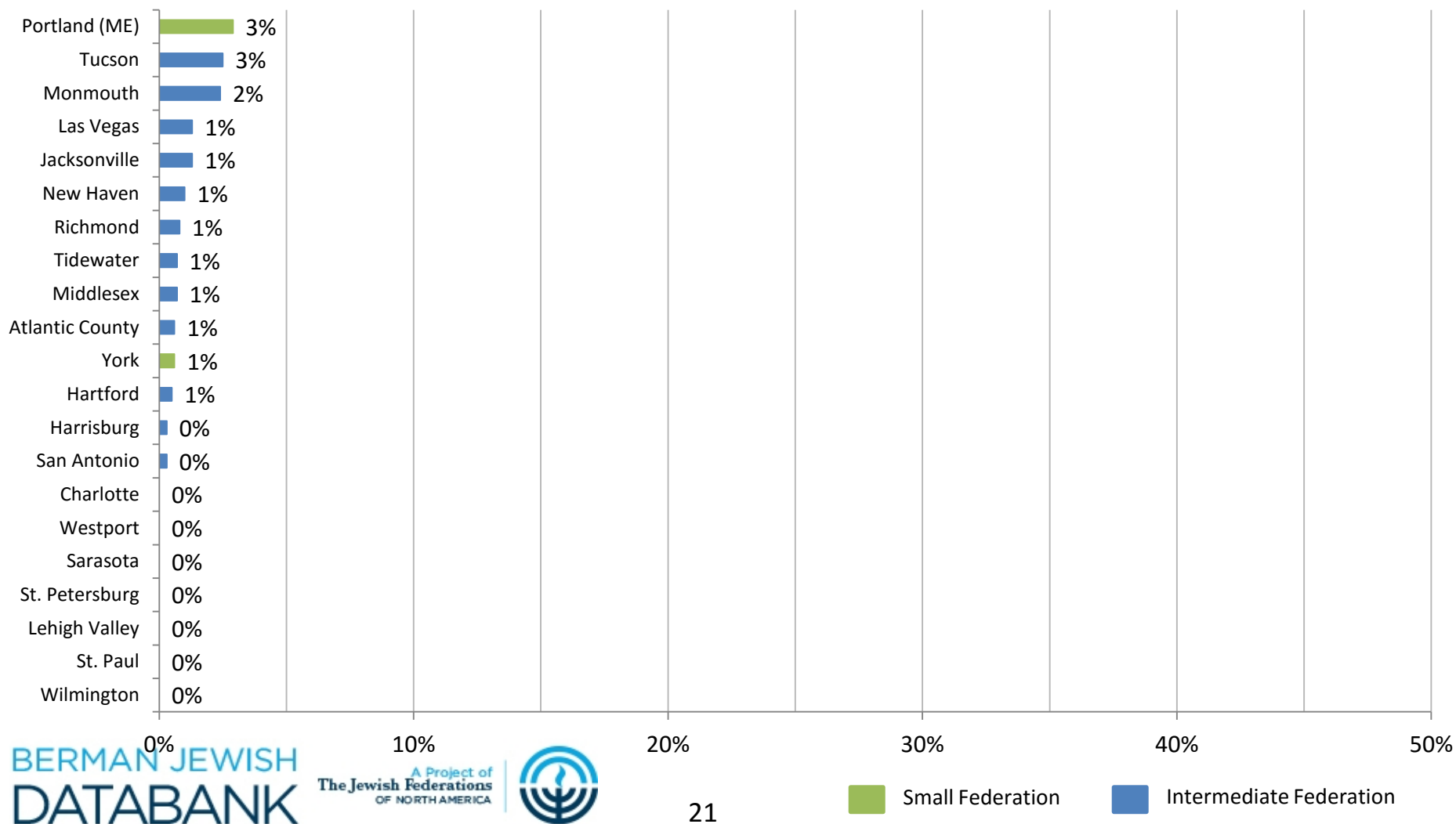
Jewish Households with Persons Age 65+: % Received Jewish In-Home Health Care for the Elderly in the Past Year



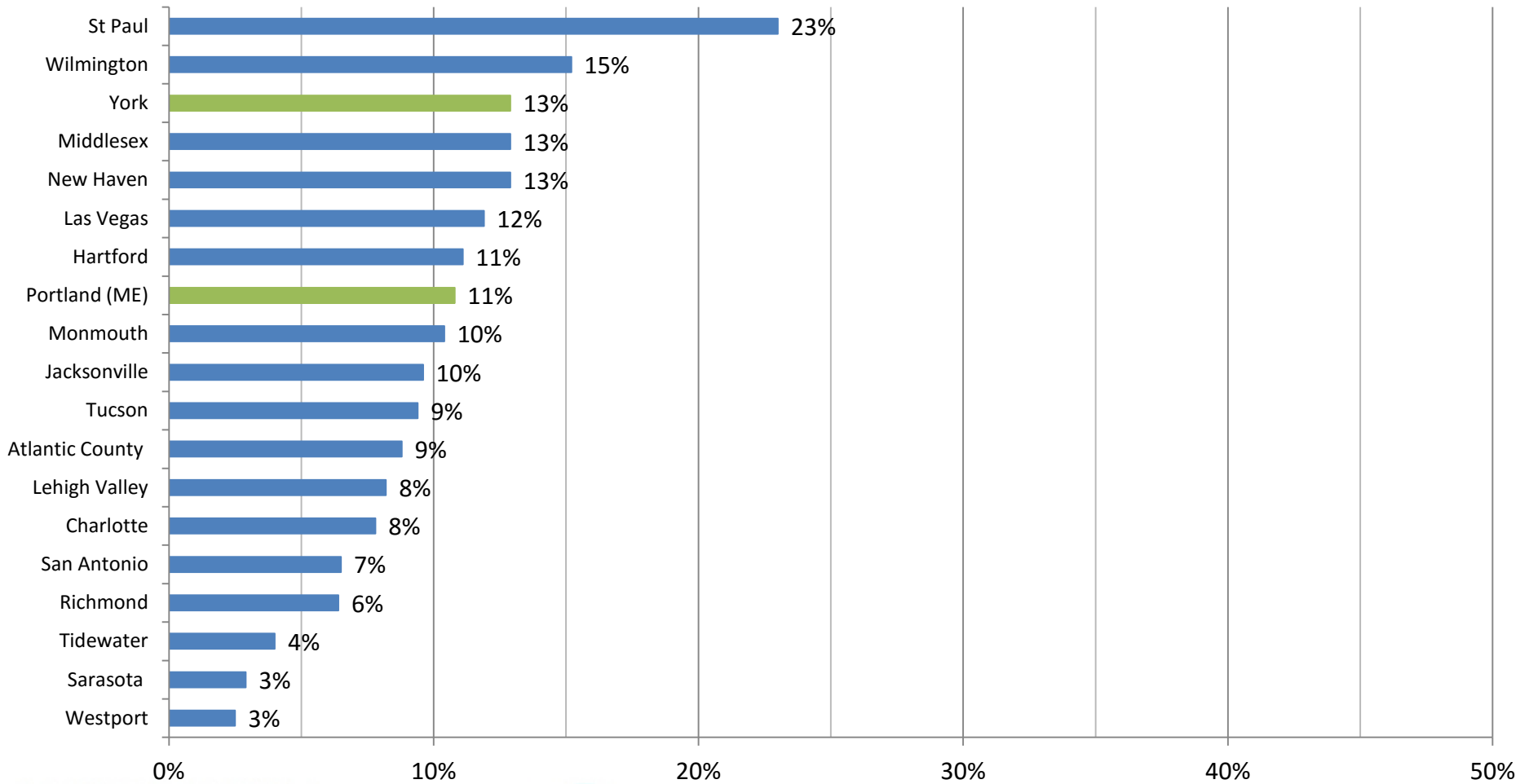
Jewish Households with Persons Age 65+: % Received Non-Jewish In-Home Health Care for the Elderly in the Past Year



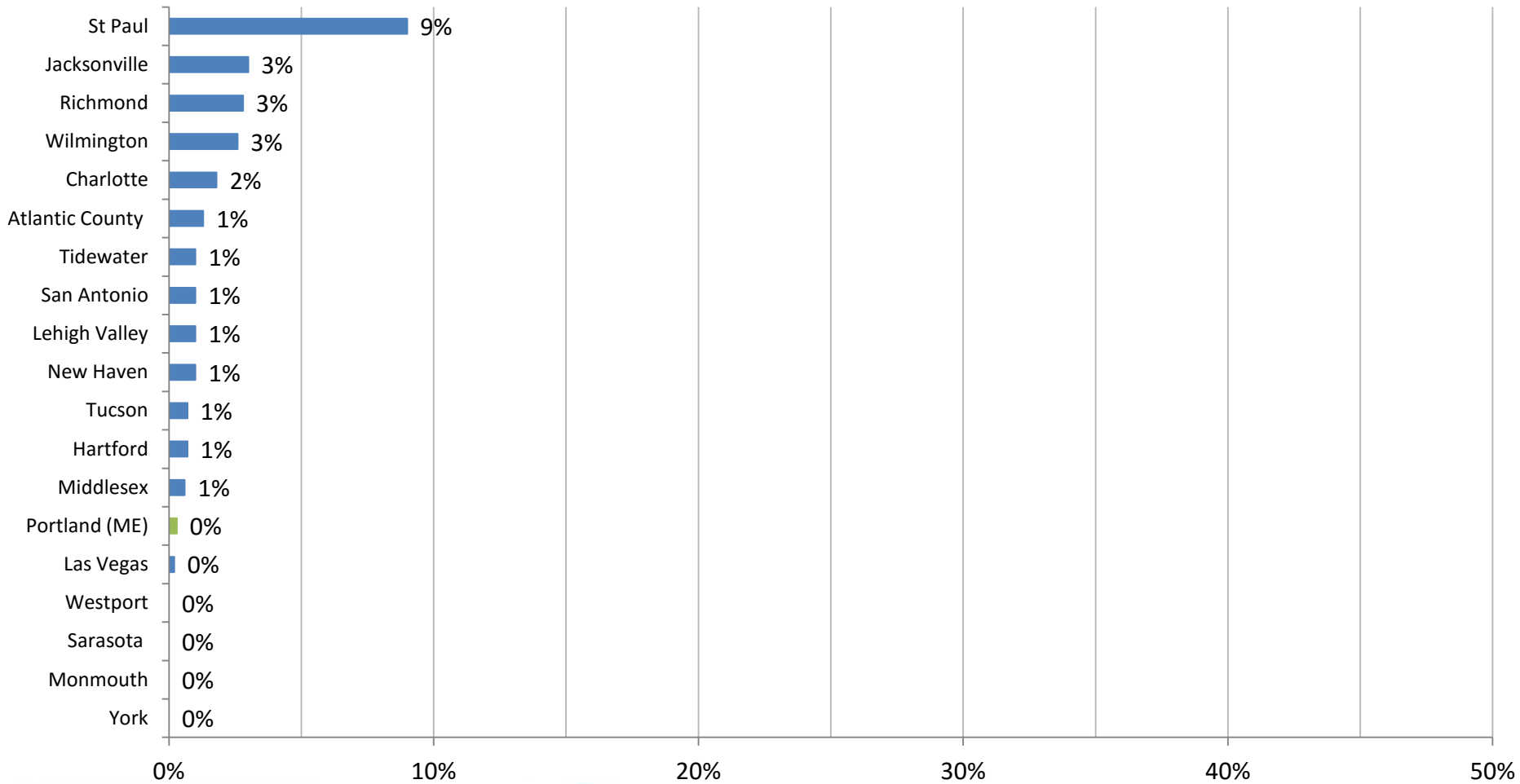
Jewish Households with Persons Age 65+: % Needed but Did Not receive In-Home Health Care for the Elderly in the Past Year



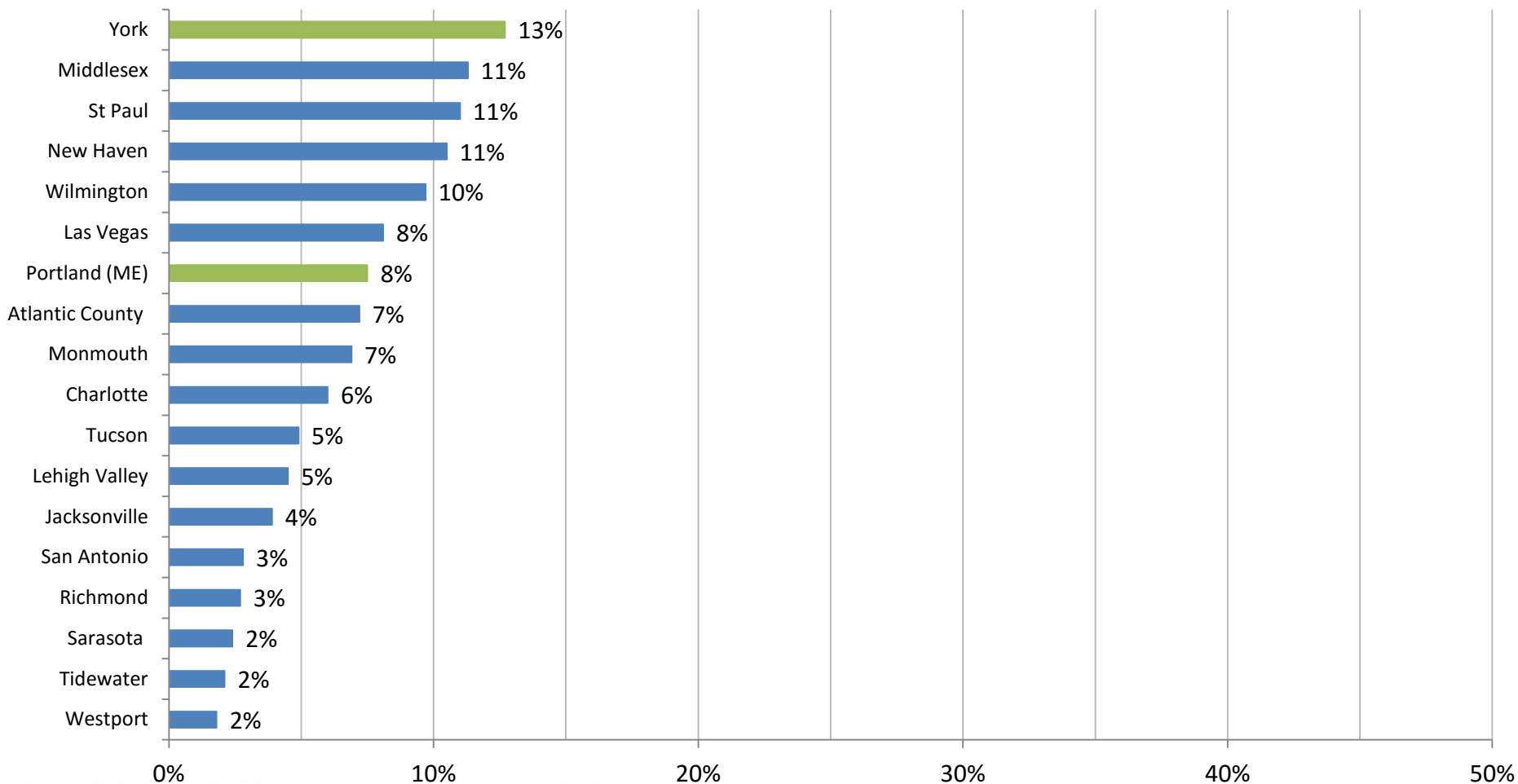
Jewish Households with Persons Age 65 and Over: % Needed Senior Transportation in the Past Year



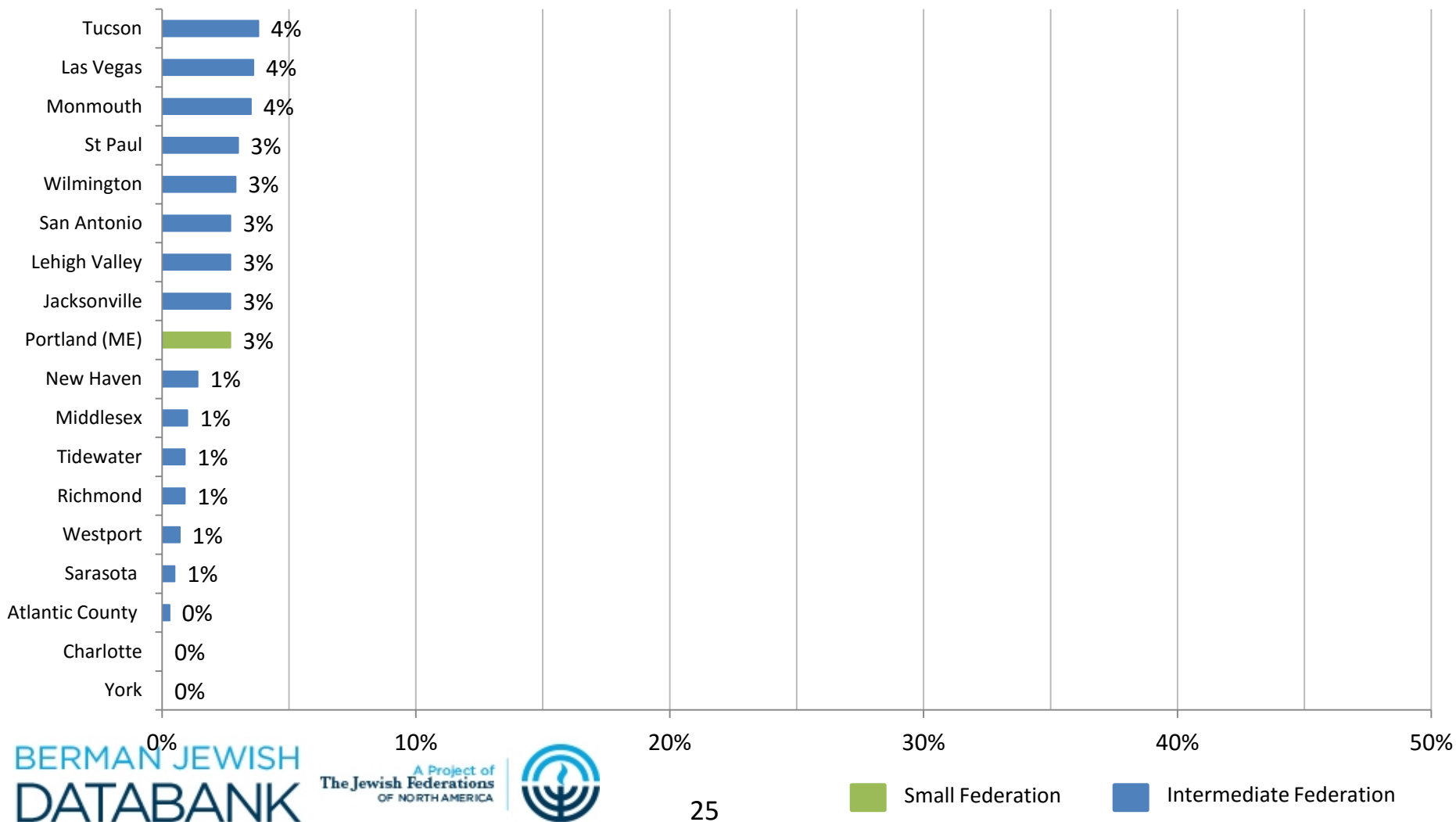
Jewish Households with Persons Age 65+: % Received Jewish Transportation Services in the Past Year



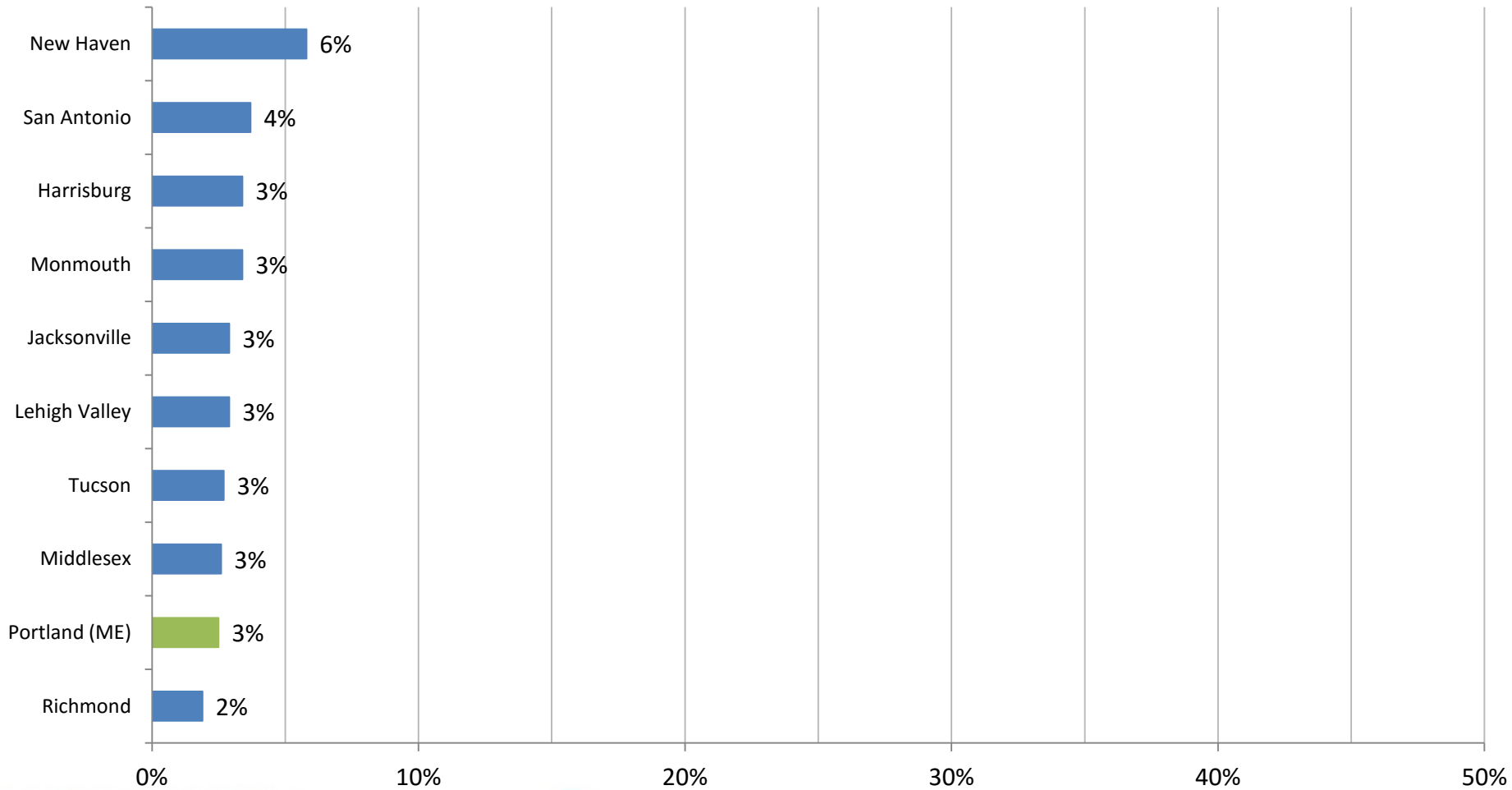
Jewish Households with Persons Age 65+: % Received Non-Jewish Transportation Services in the Past Year



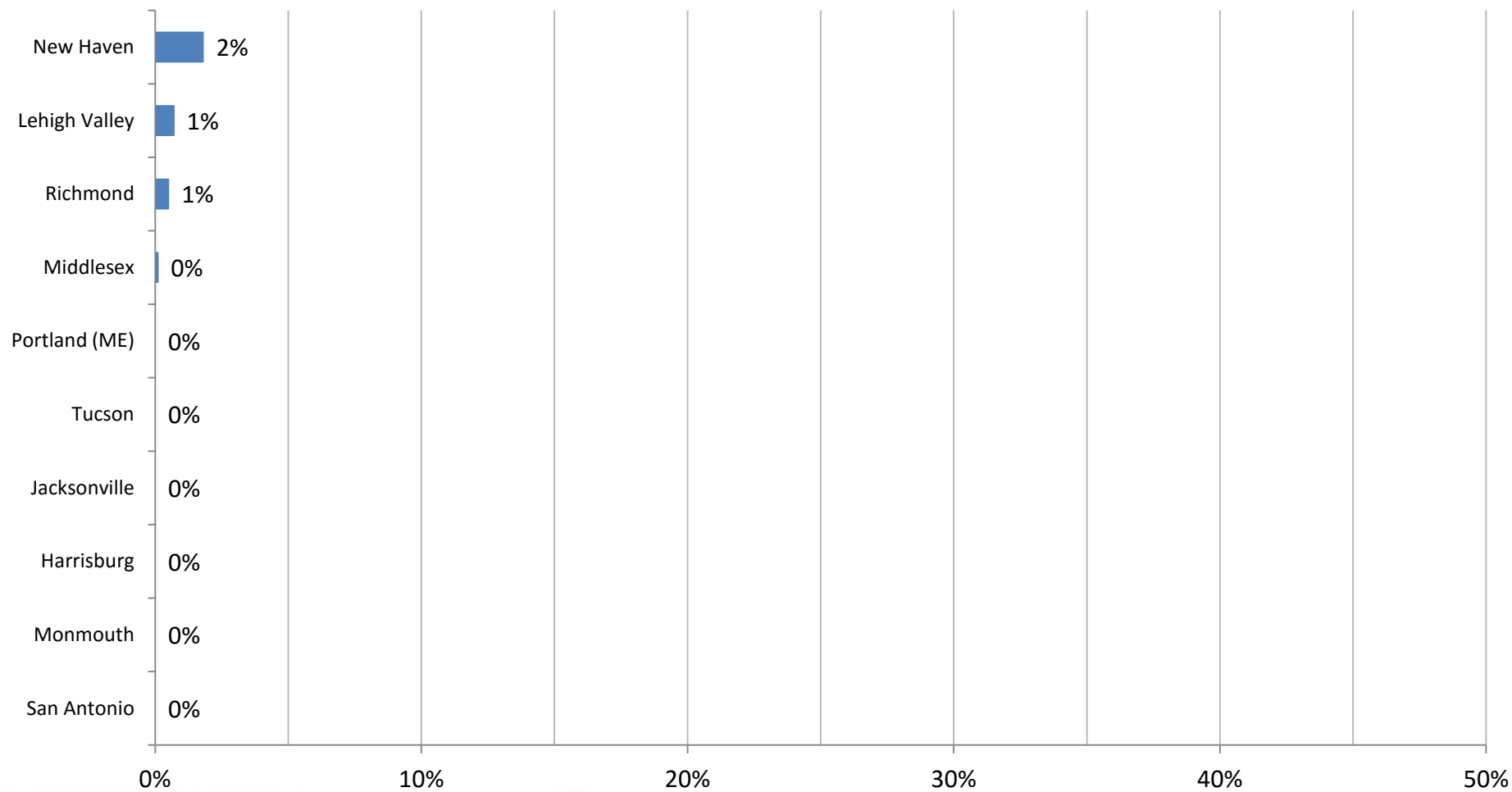
Jewish Households with Persons Age 65+: % Needed but Did Not Receive Needed Transportation Services in the Past Year



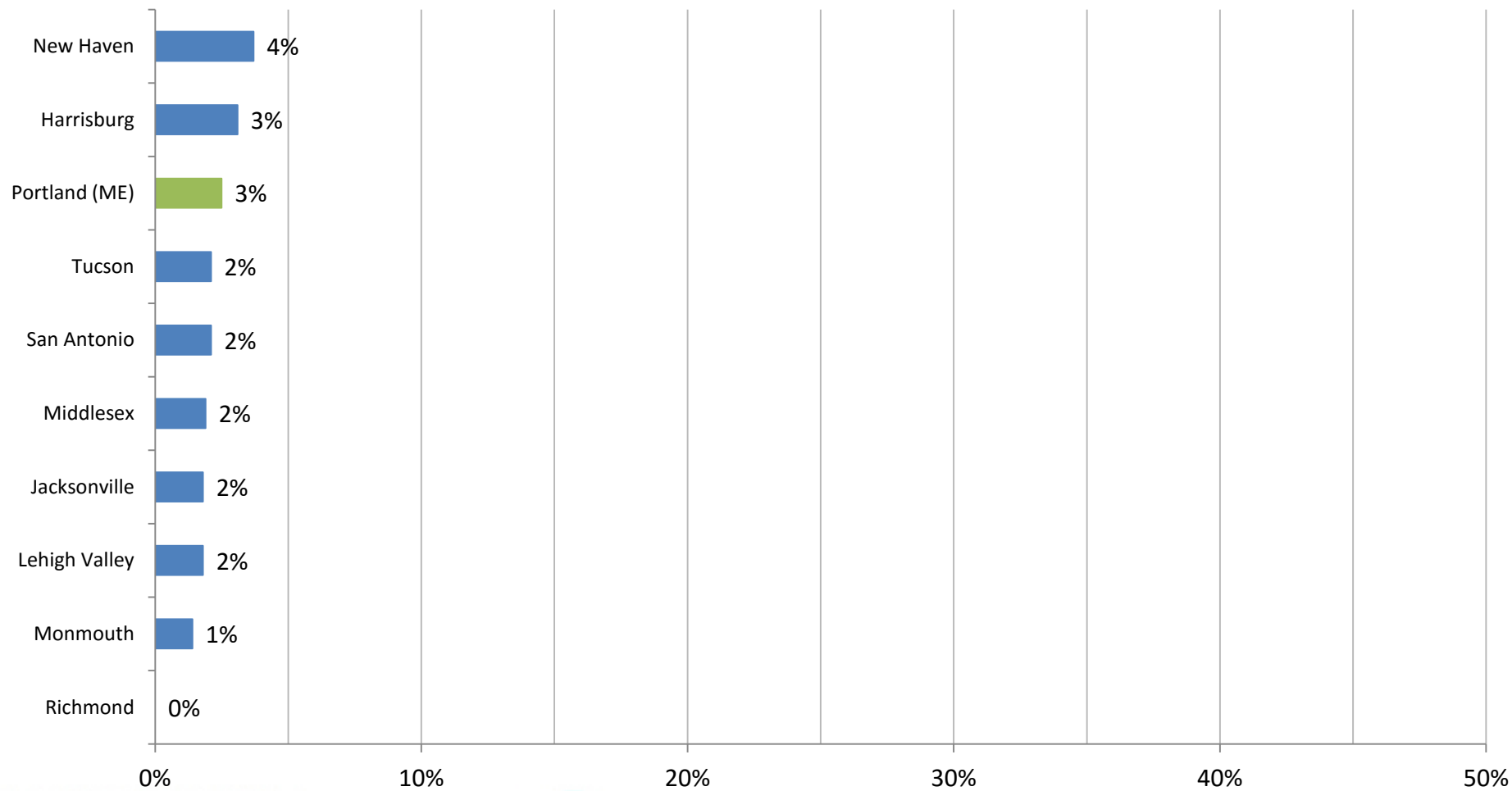
Jewish Households with Persons Age 65+: % Needed Assisted Living Facility in the Past Year



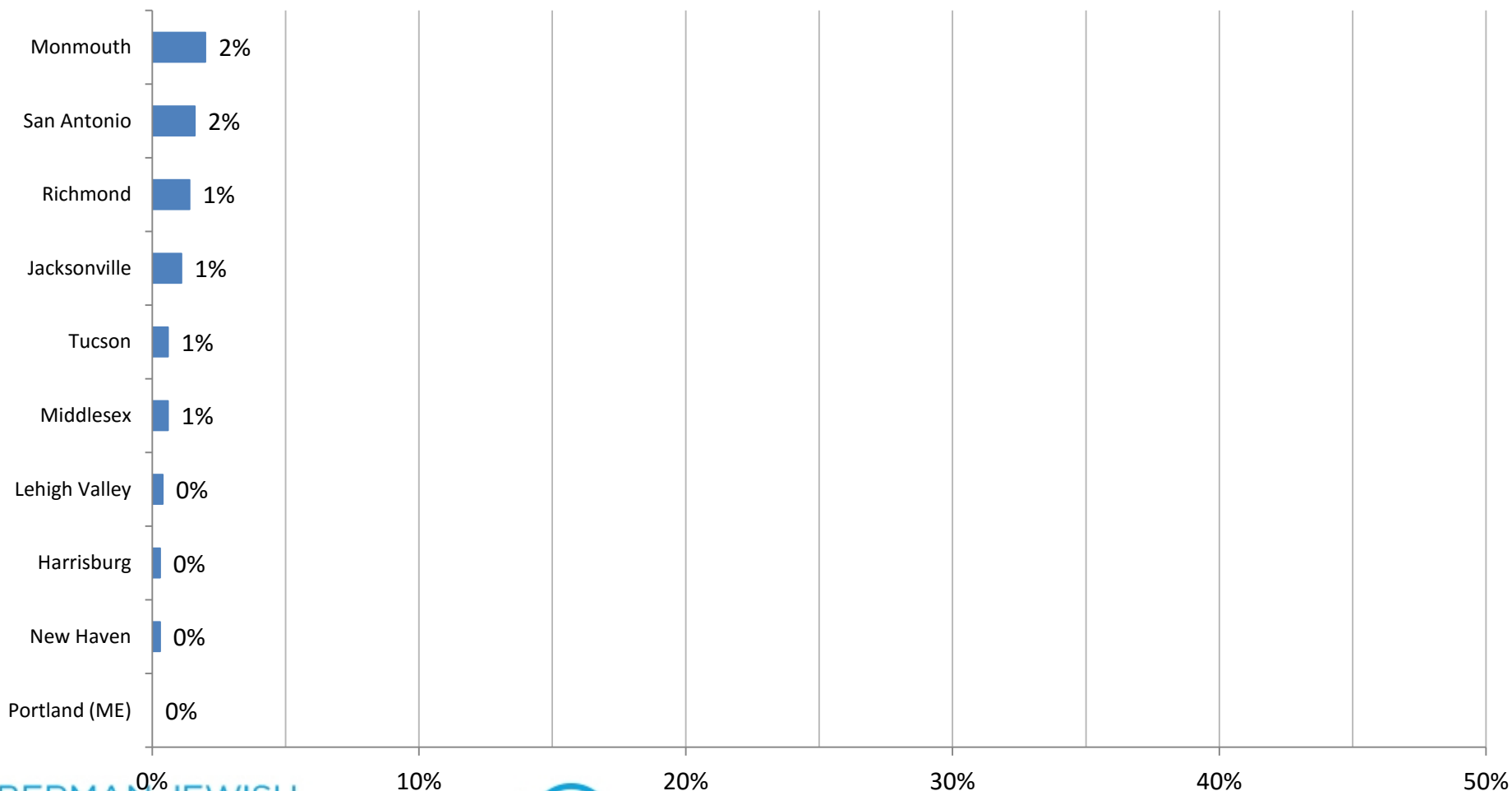
Jewish Households with Persons Age 65+: % Moved Into Jewish Assisted Living Facility in the Past Year



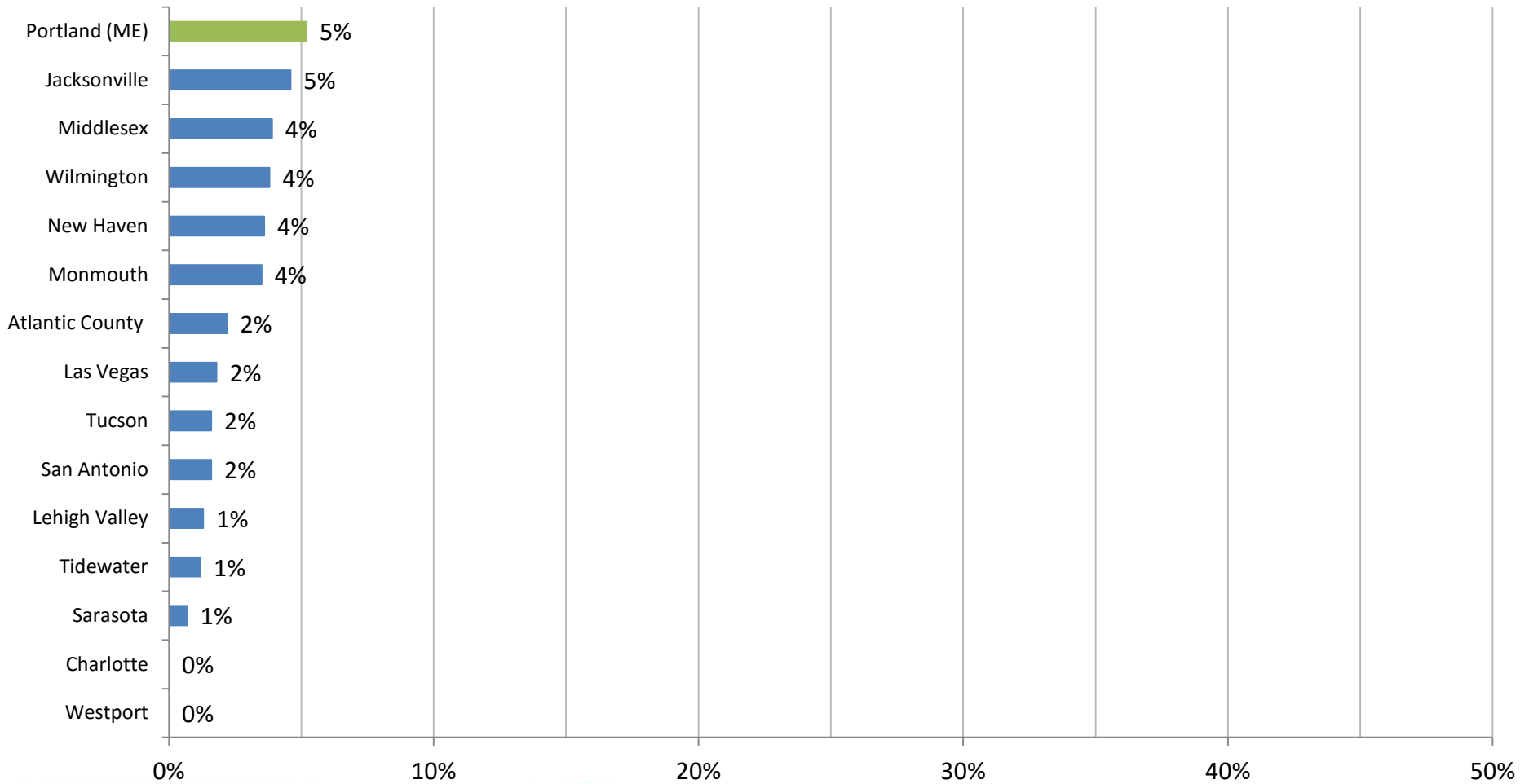
Jewish Households with Persons Age 65+: % Moved Into a Non-Jewish Assisted Living Facility in the Past Year



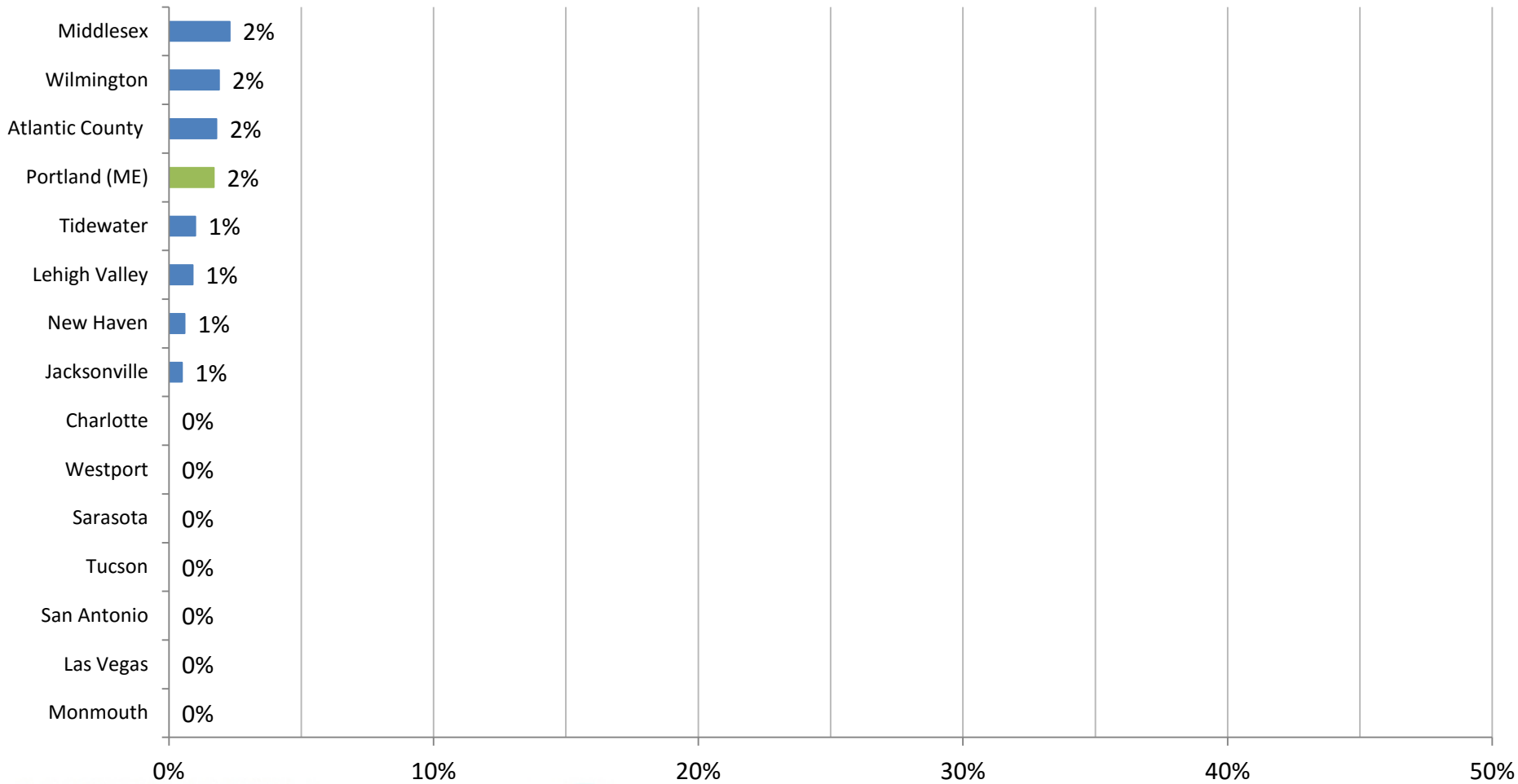
Jewish Households with Persons Age 65+: % Needed but Did Not Move Into Assisted Living Facility in the Past Year



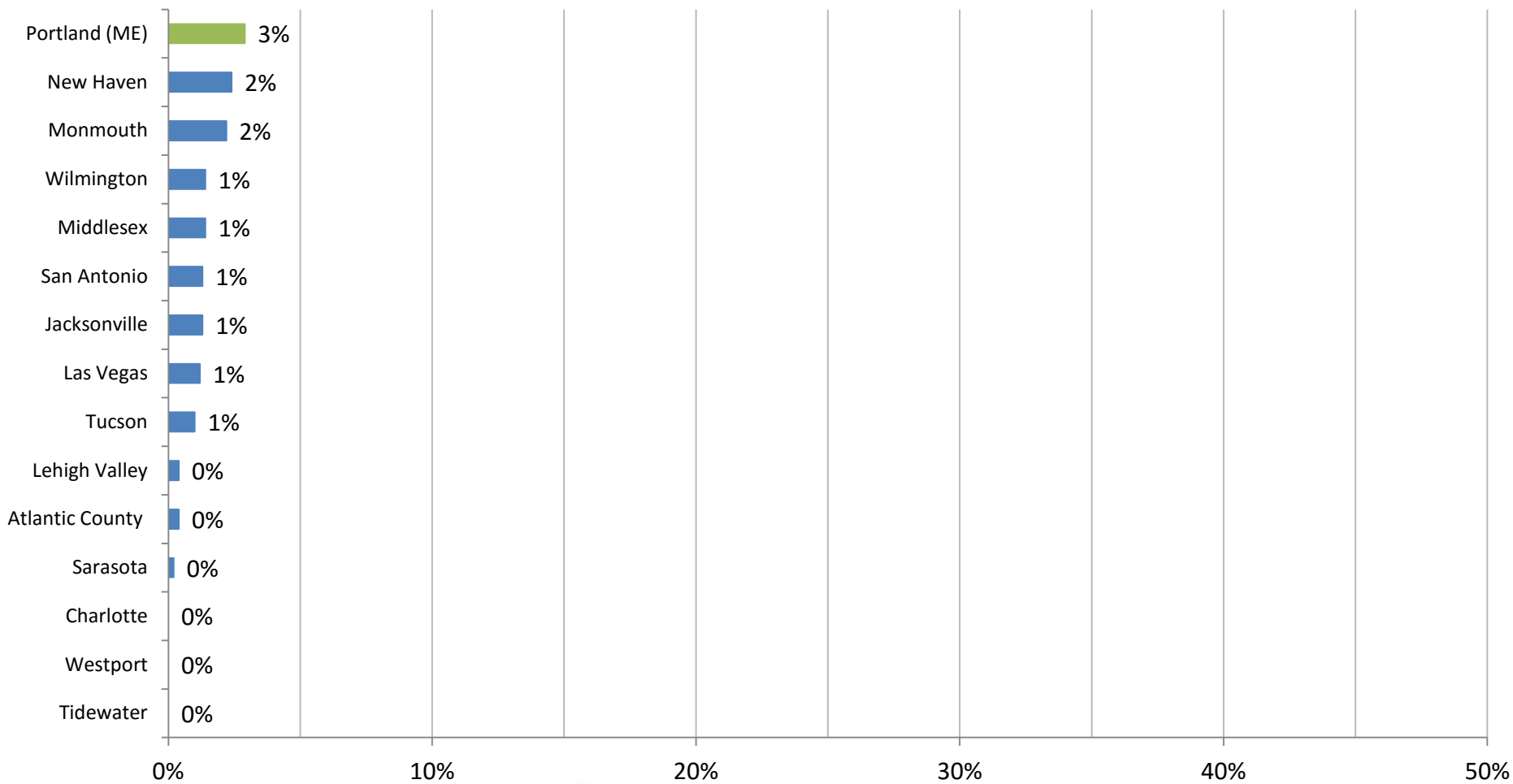
Jewish Households with Persons Age 65+: % Needed Home Delivered Meals in the Past Year



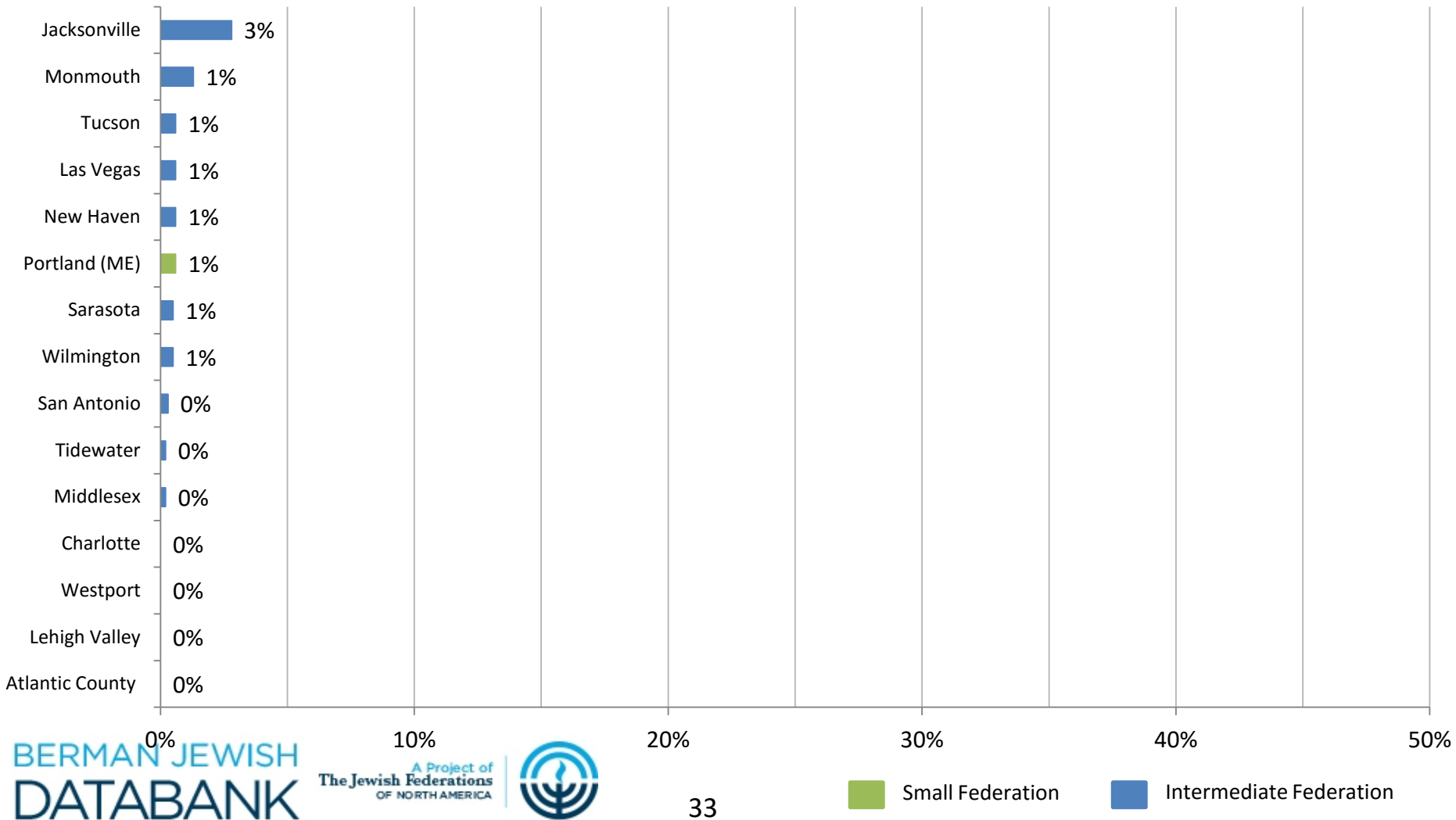
Jewish Households with Persons Age 65+: % Received Jewish Home Delivered Meals in the Past Year



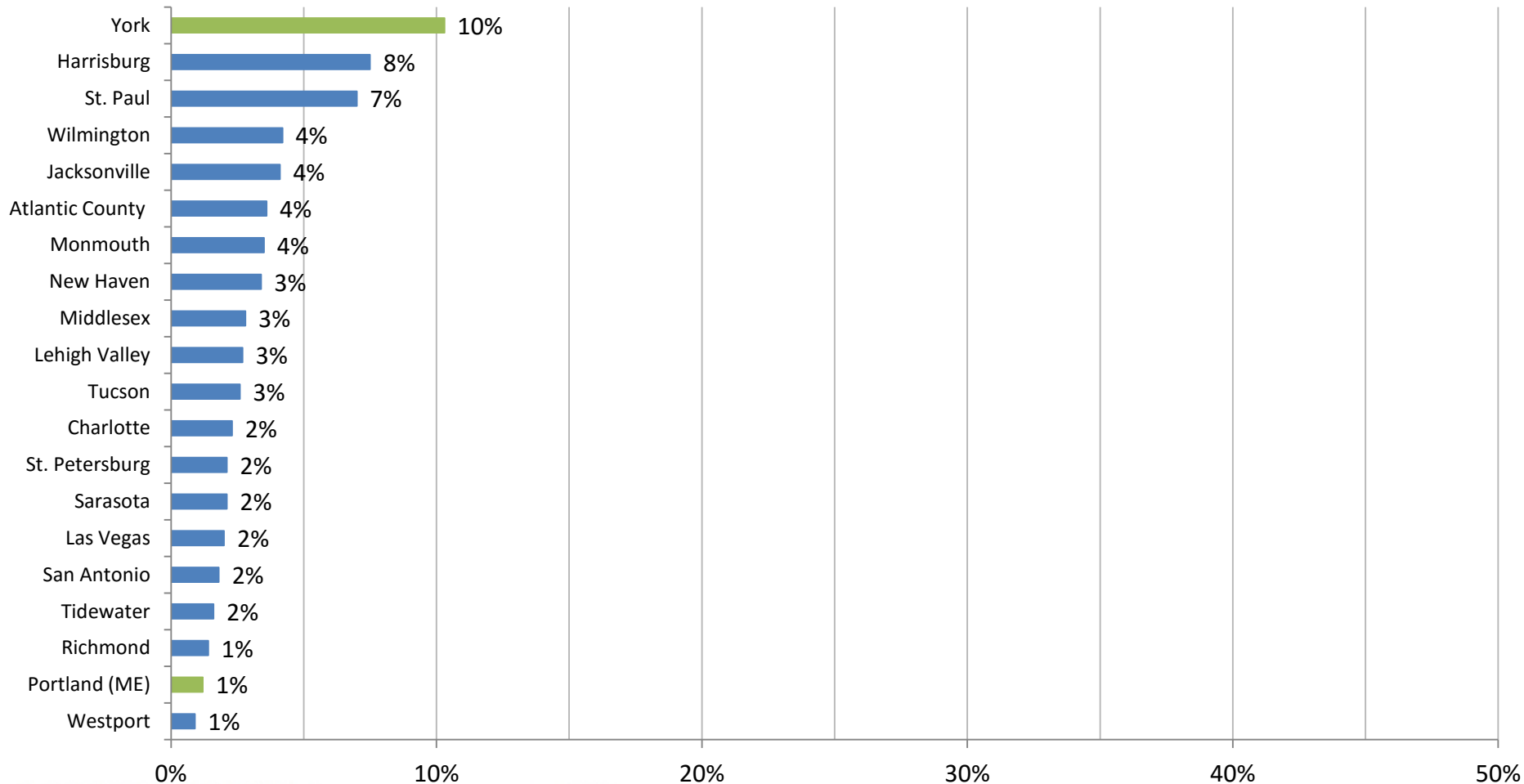
Jewish Households with Persons Age 65+: % Received Non-Jewish Home Delivered Meals in the Past Year



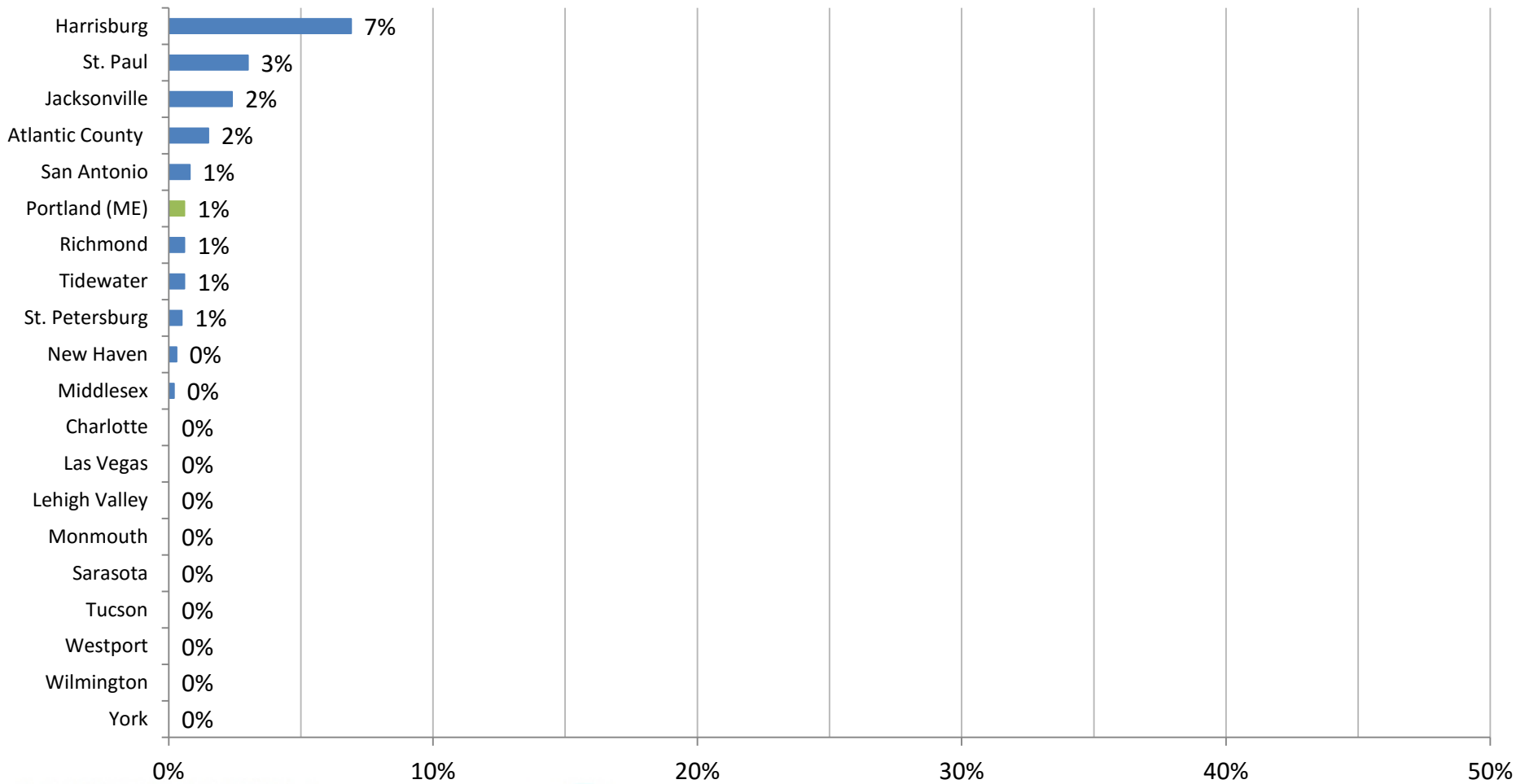
Jewish Households with Persons Age 65+: % Needed but Did Not Receive Home Delivered Meals in the Past Year



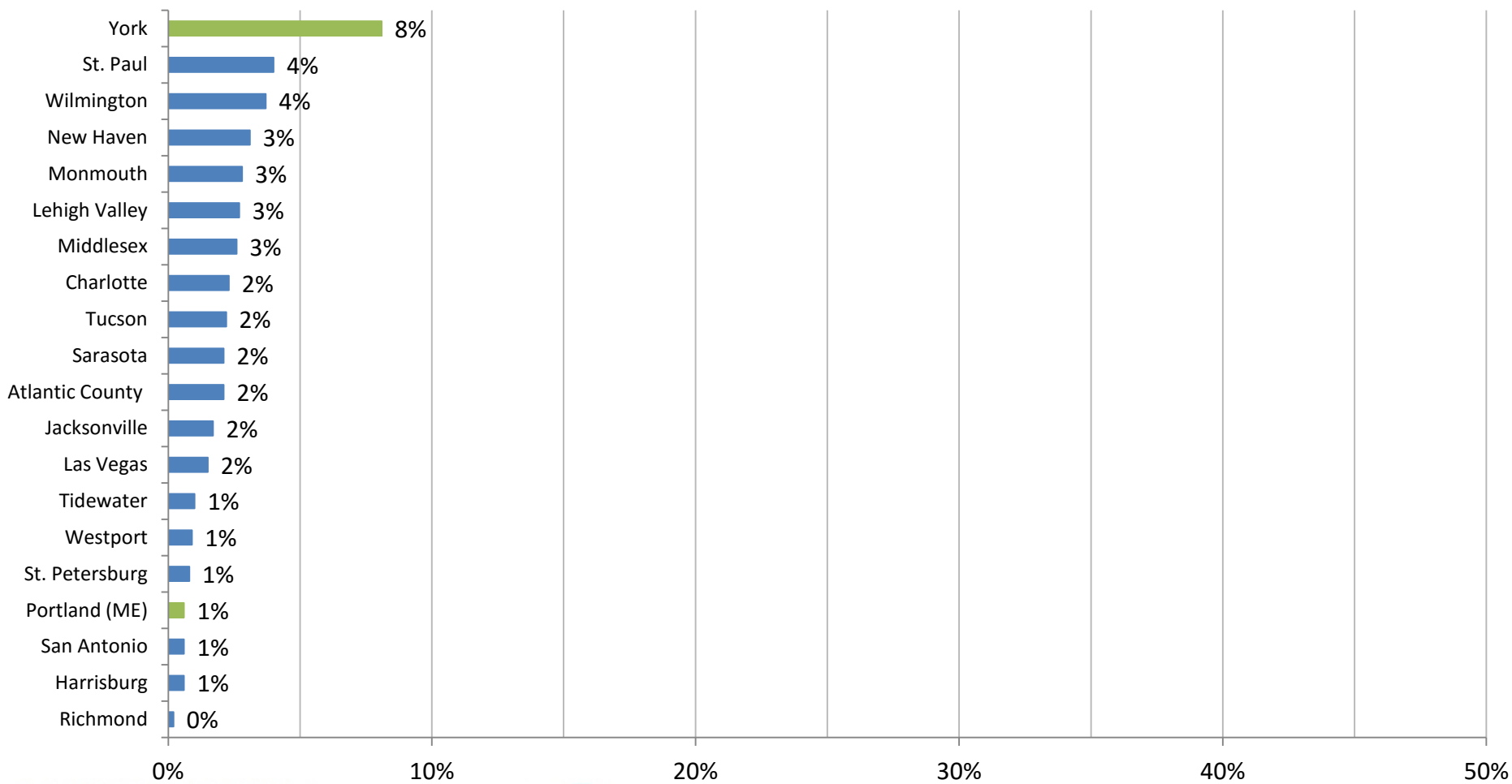
Jewish Households with Persons Age 65+: % Needed Nursing Home Care in the Past Year



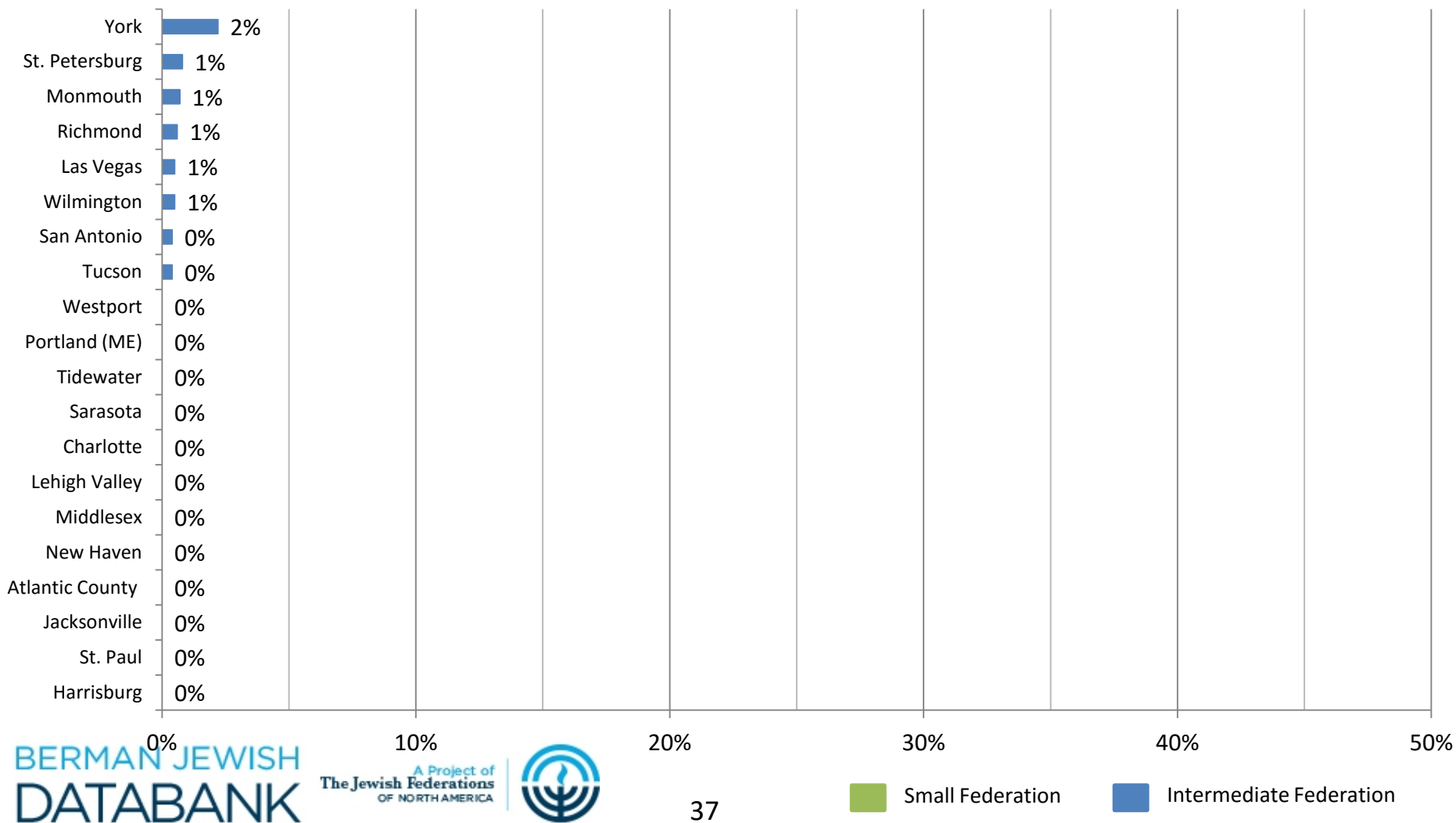
Jewish Households with Persons Age 65+: % Received Jewish Nursing Home Care in the Past Year



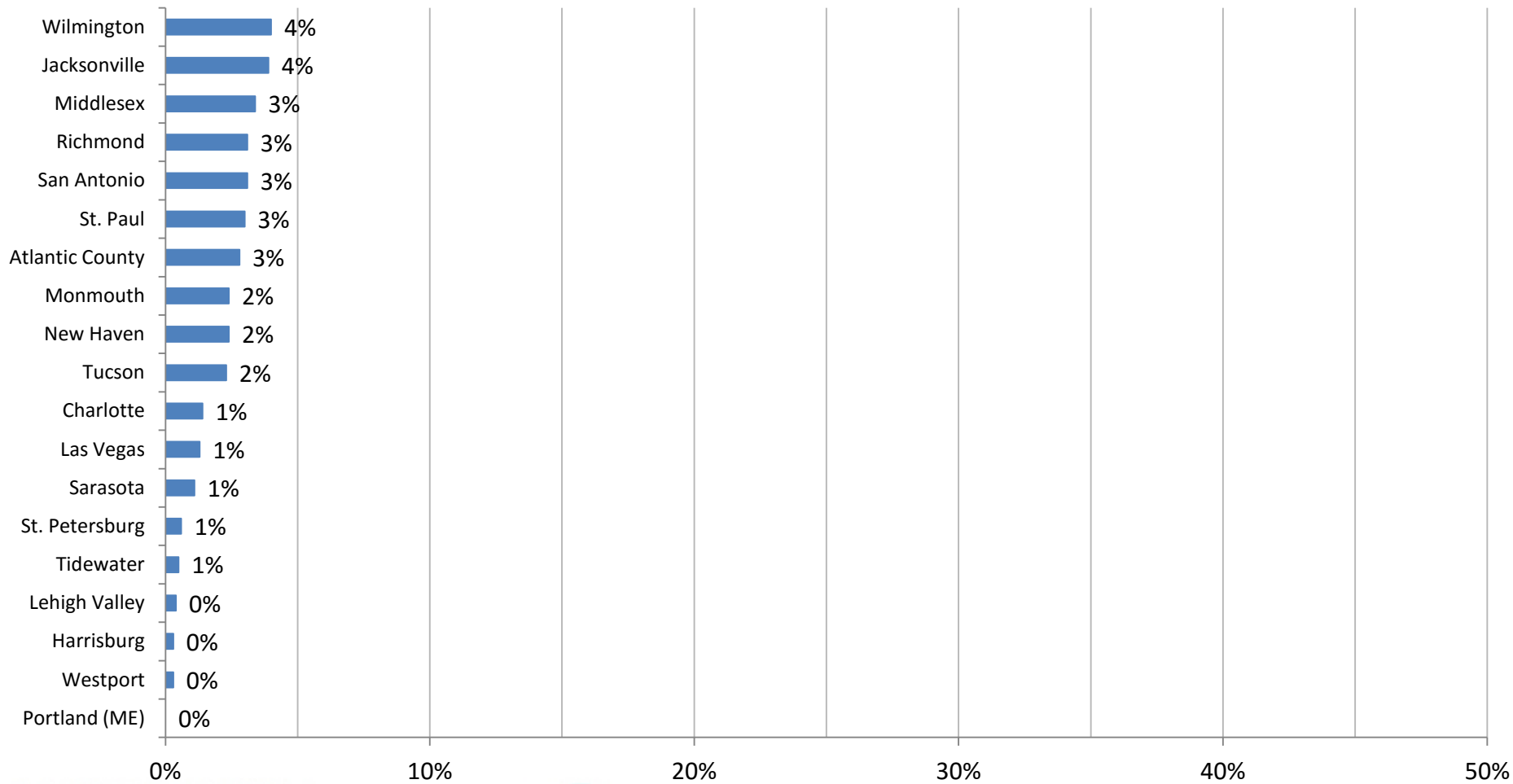
Jewish Households with Persons Age 65+: % Received Non-Jewish Nursing Home Care in the Past Year



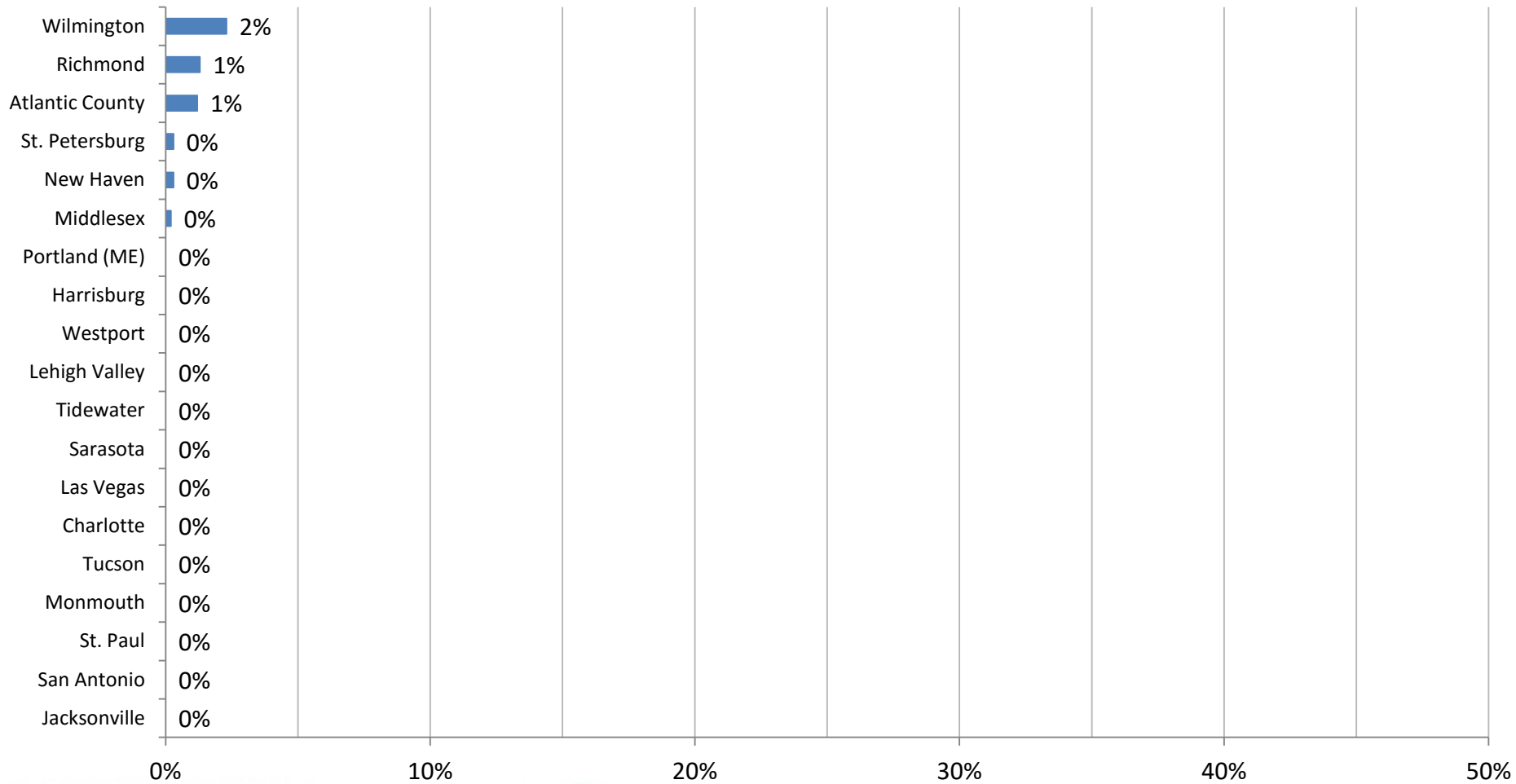
Jewish Households with Persons Age 65+: % Needed but Did Not Receive Nursing Home Care



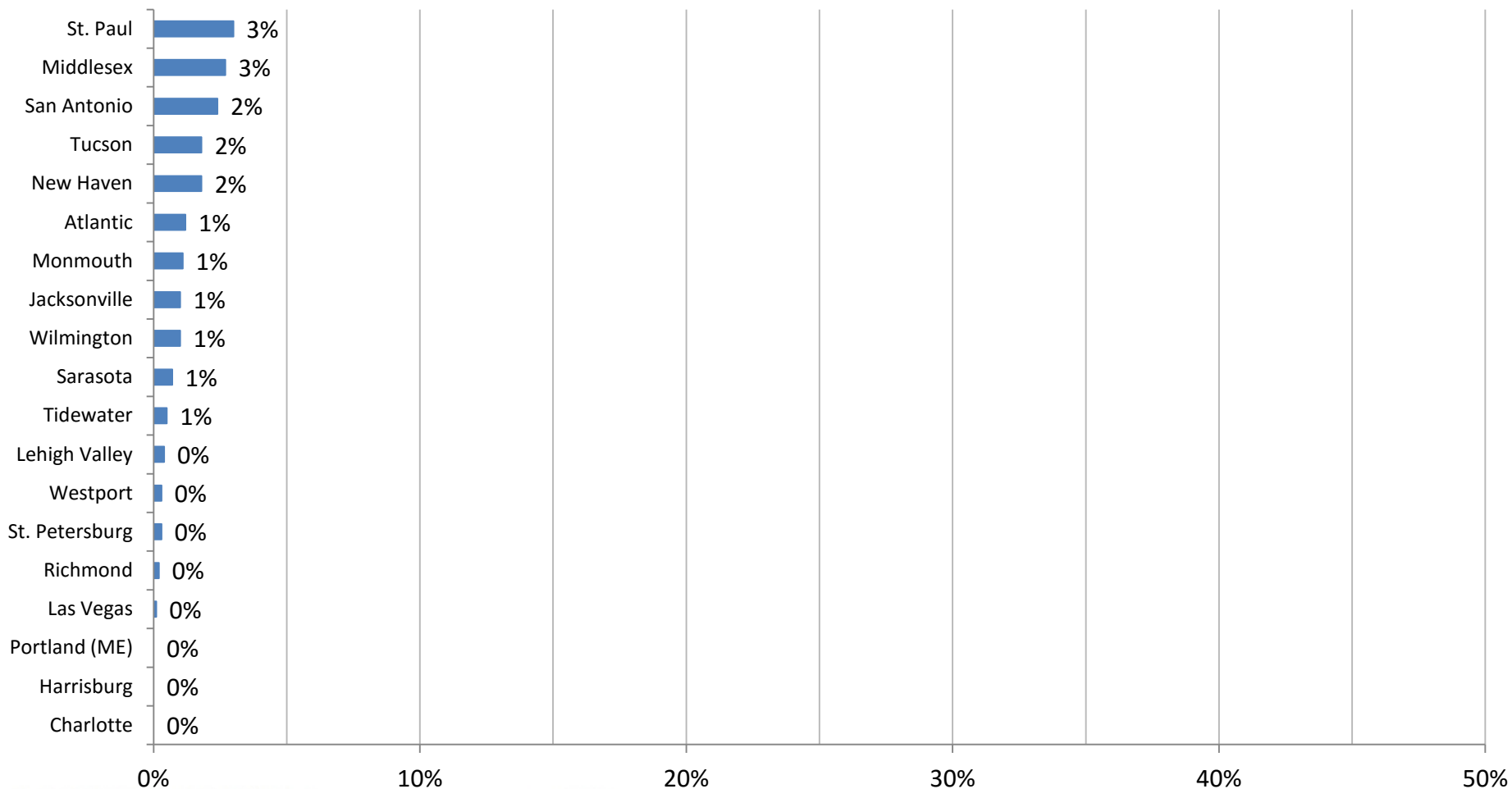
Jewish Households with Persons Age 65+: % Needed Adult Day Care in the Past Year



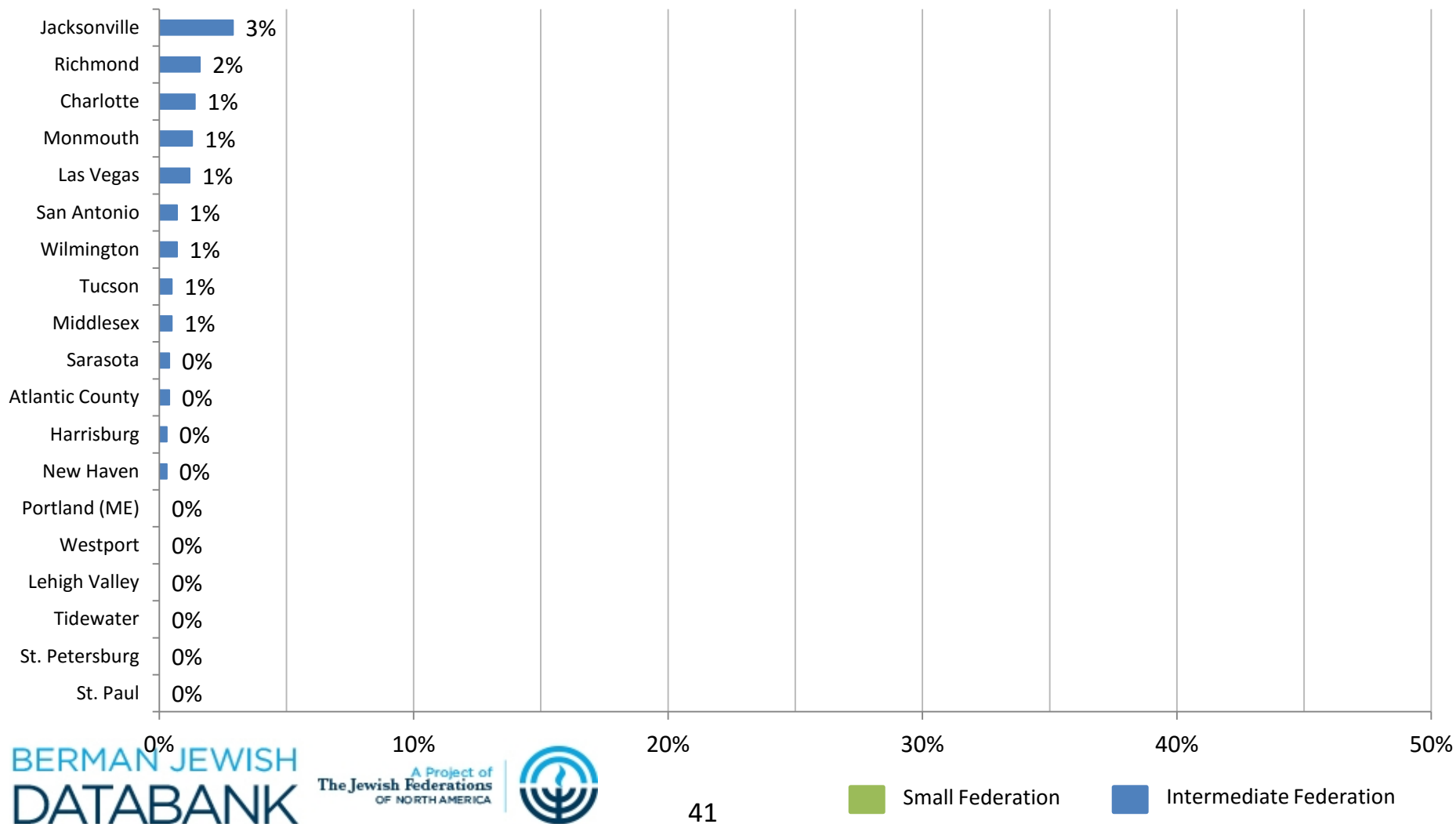
Jewish Households with Persons Age 65+: % Received Jewish Adult Day Care in the Past Year



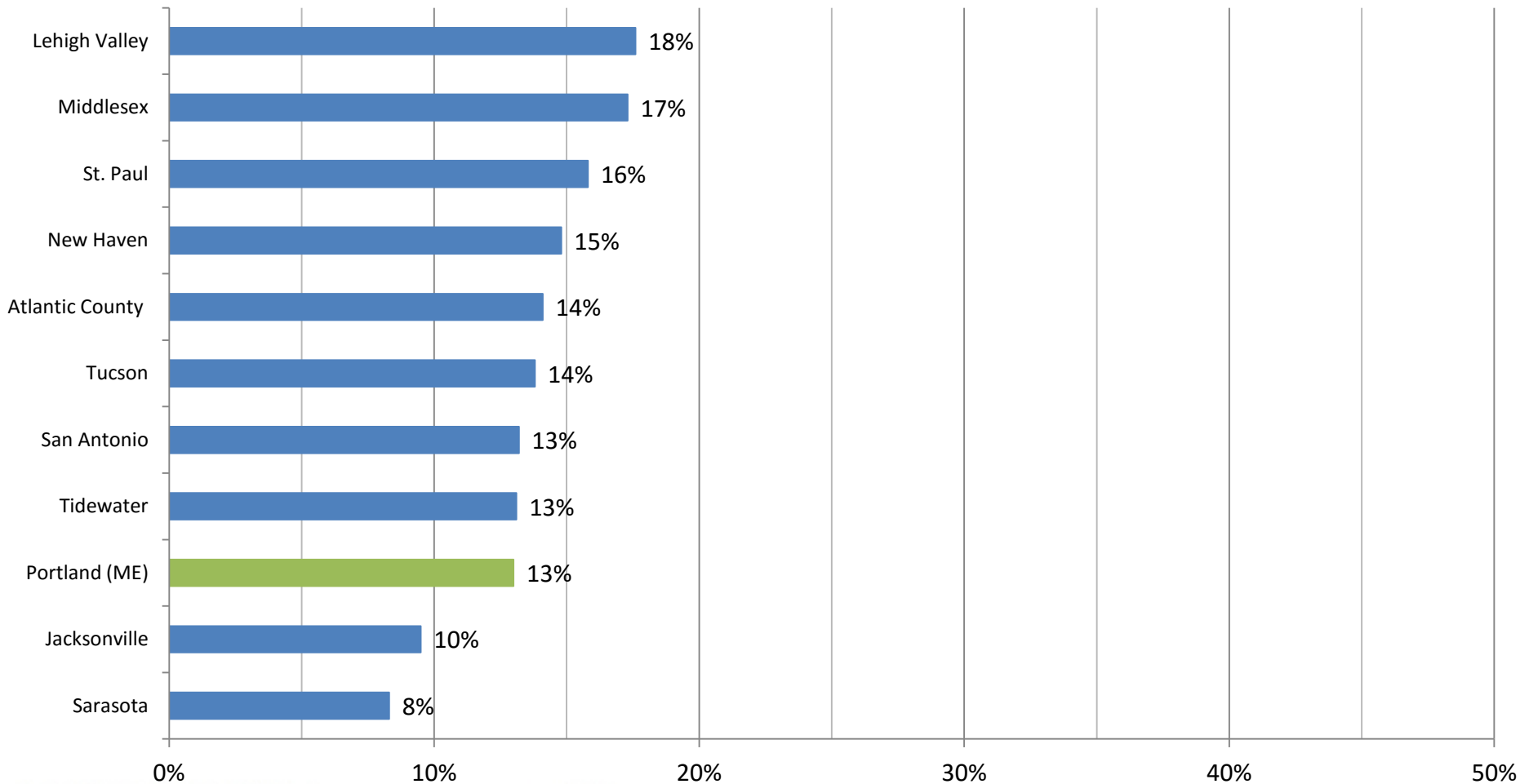
Jewish Households with Persons Age 65+: % Received Non-Jewish Adult Day Care in the Past Year



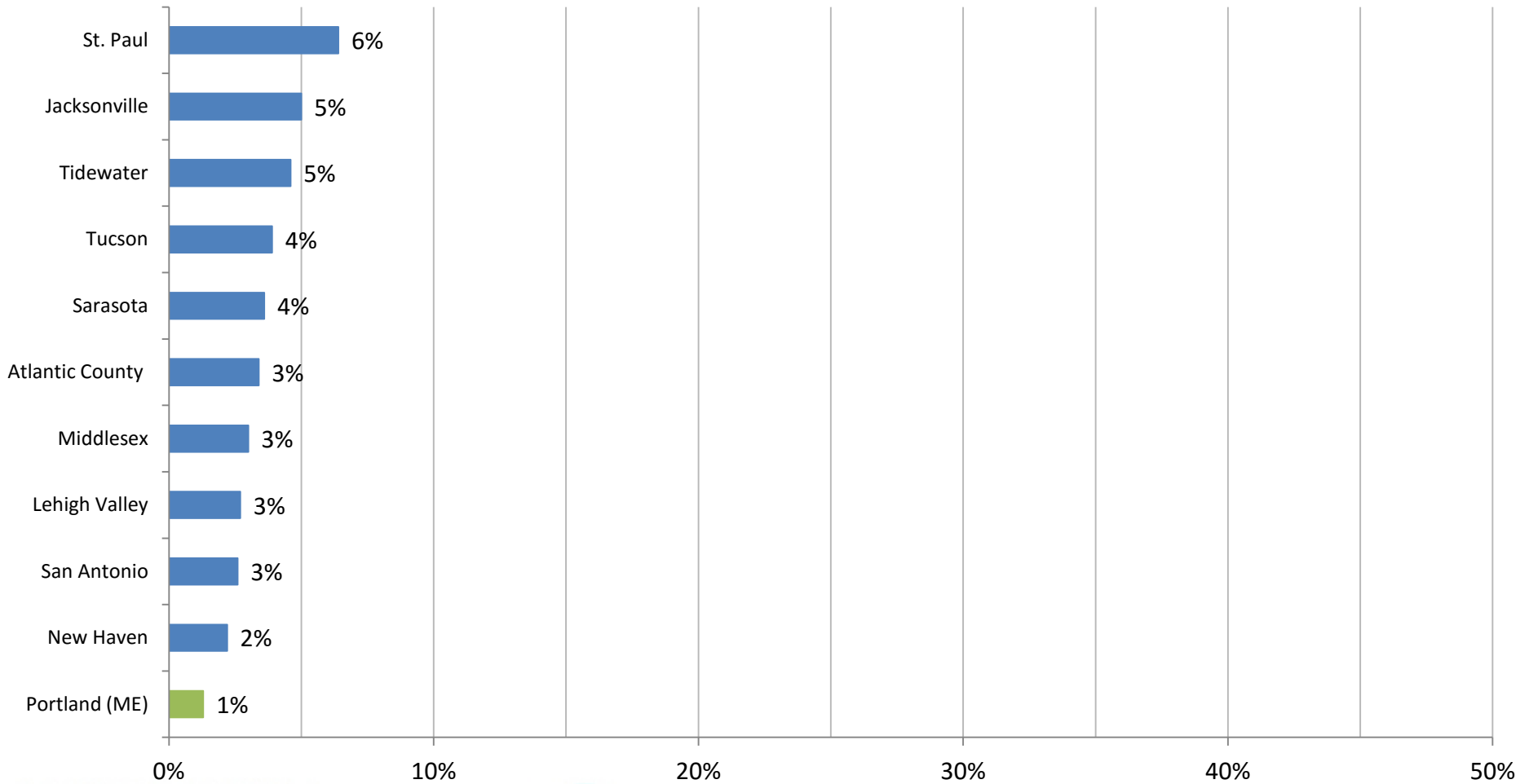
Jewish Households with Persons Age 65+: % Needed but Did Not Receive Adult Day Care



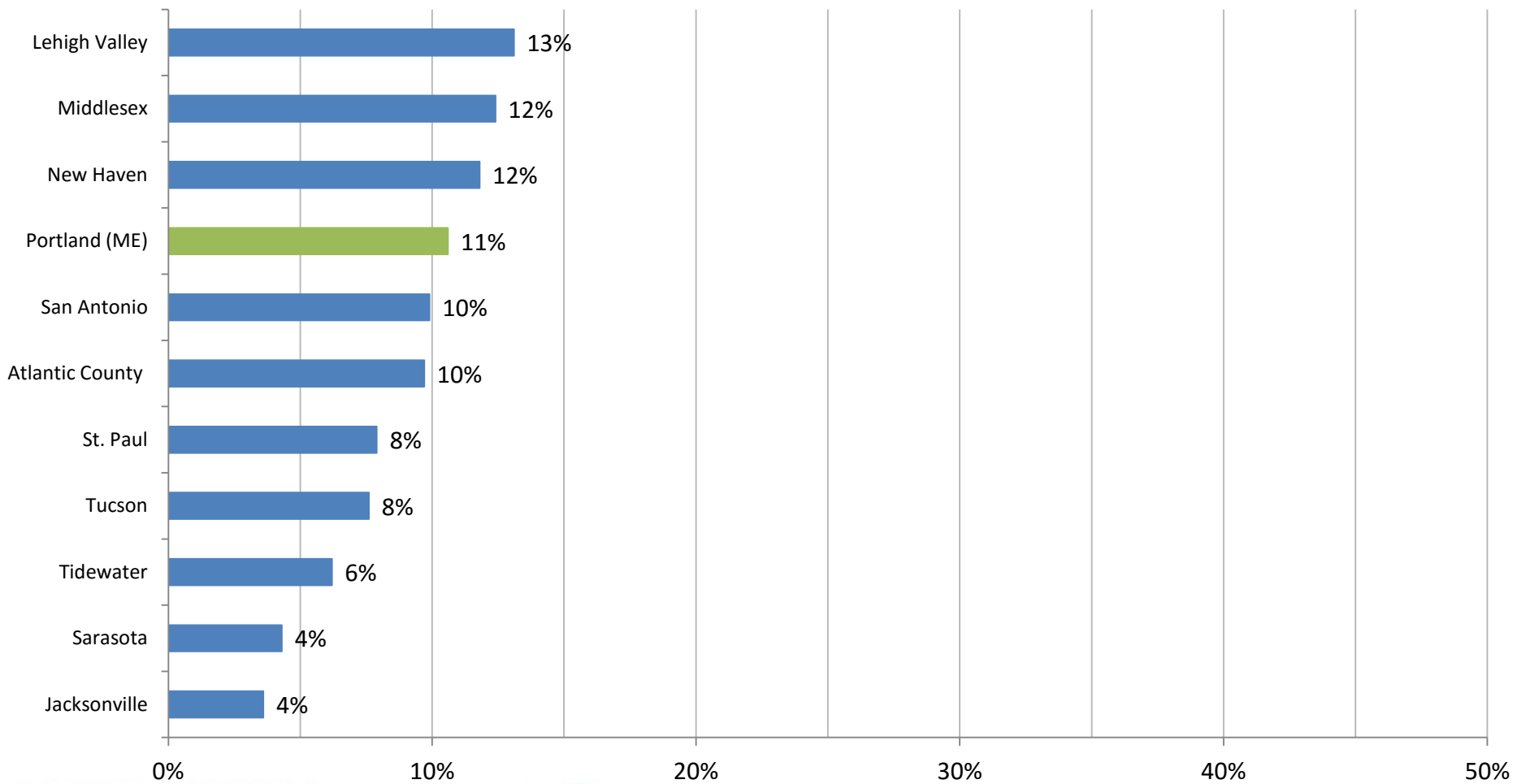
Jewish Households: % Needed Help in Coordinating Services for an Elderly or Disabled Person in the Past Year



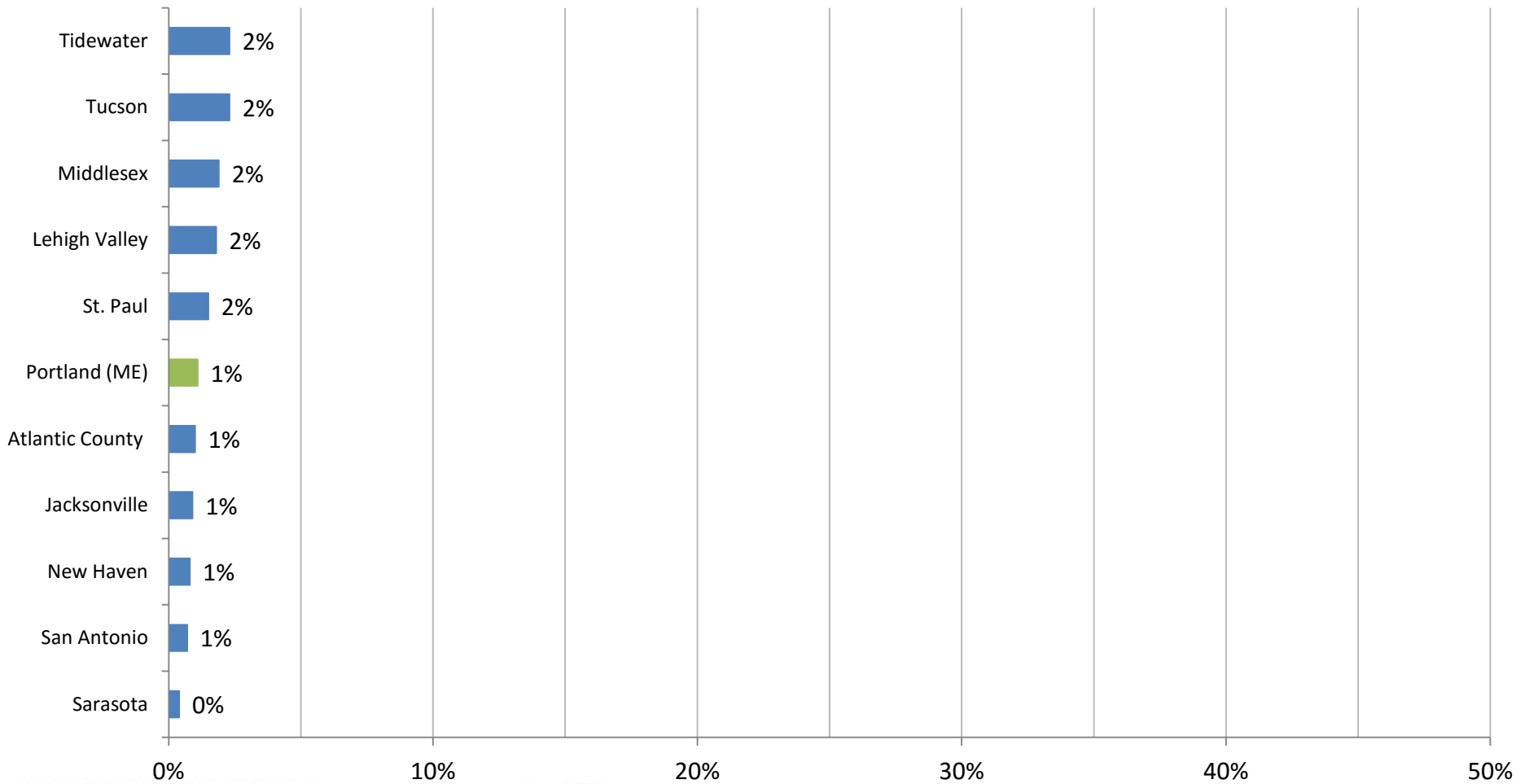
Jewish Households: % Received Jewish Help Coordinating Services for an Elderly or Disabled Person in the Past Year



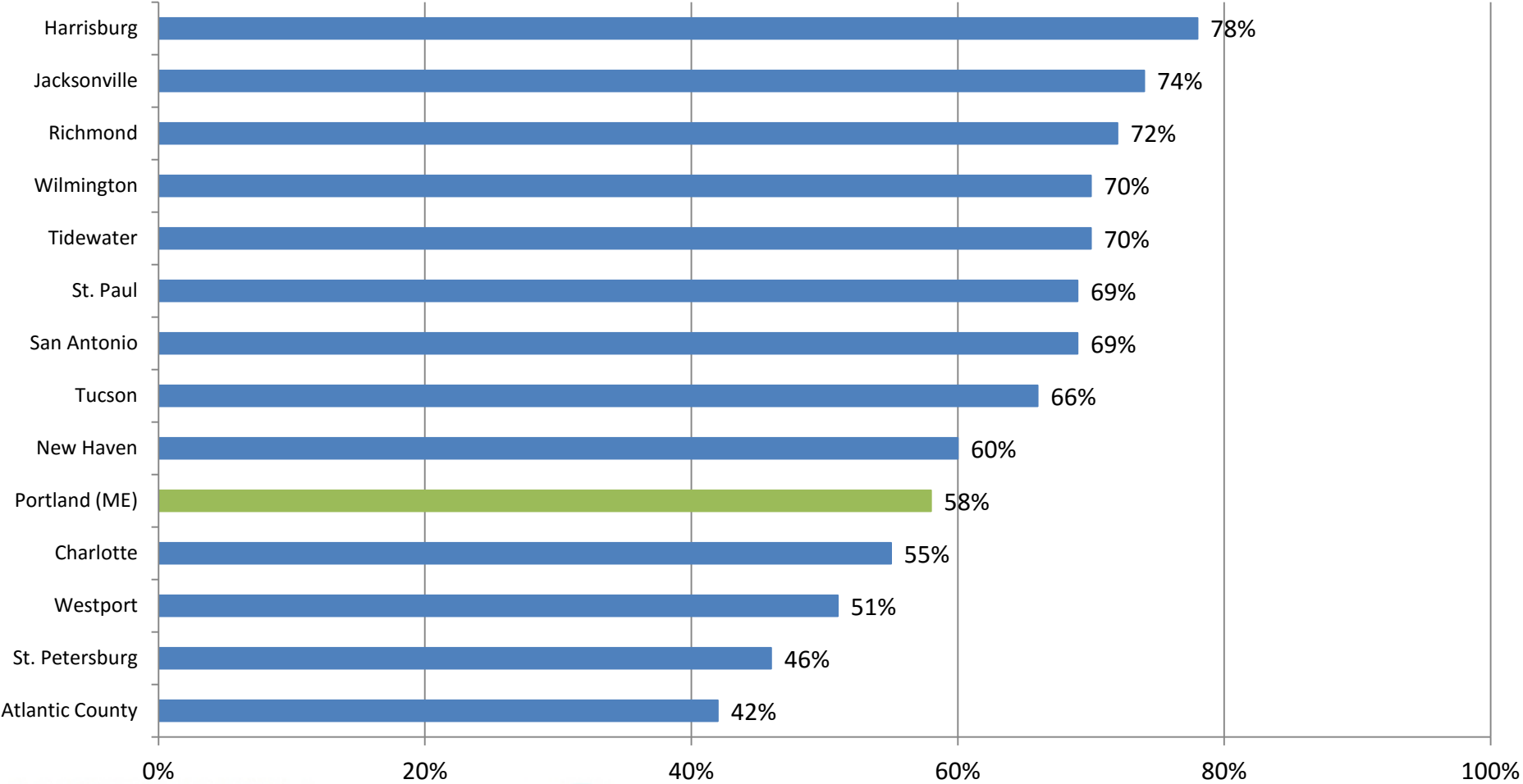
Jewish Households: % Received Non-Jewish Help Coordinating Services for an Elderly or Disabled Person in the Past Year



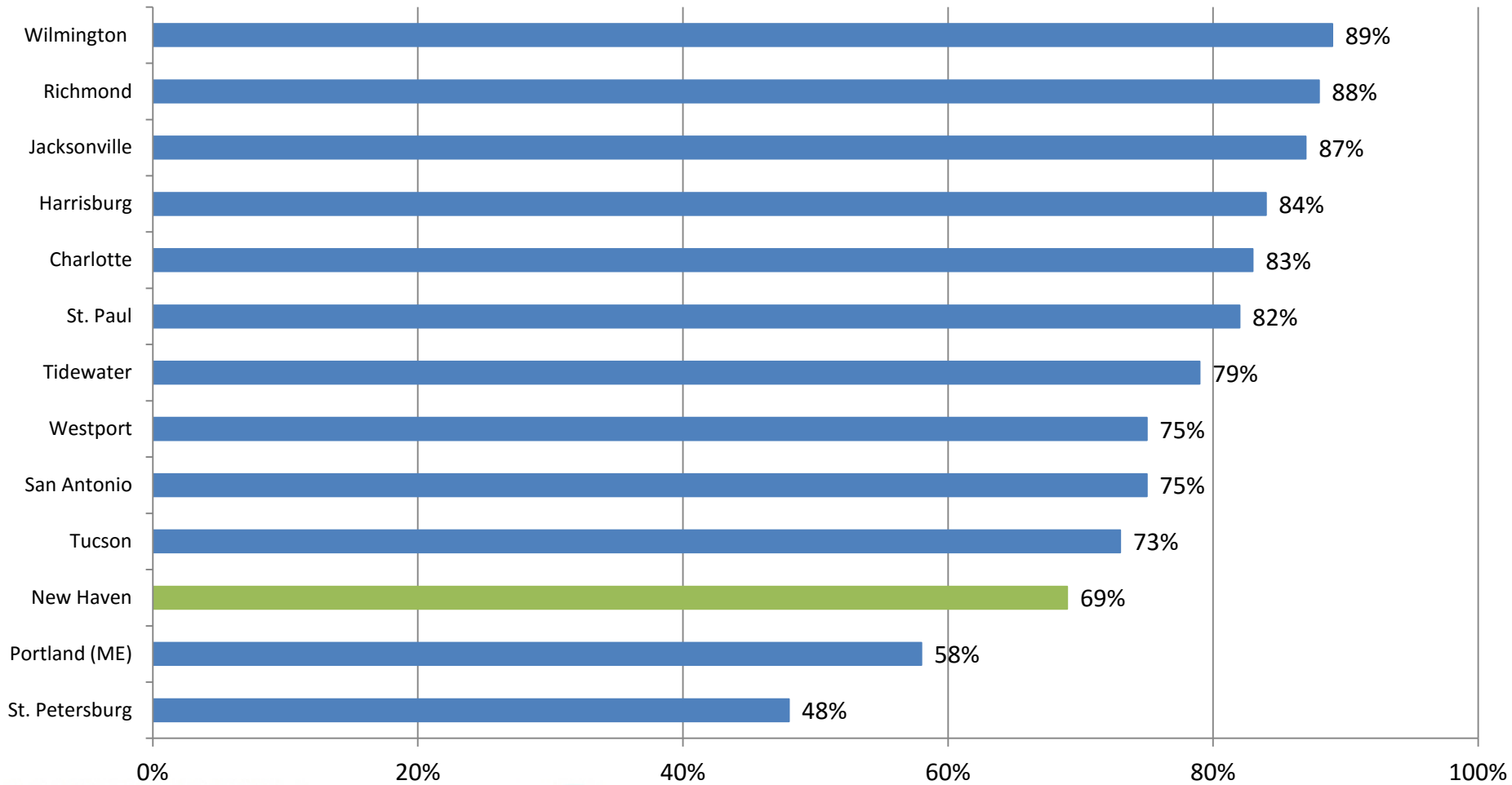
Jewish Households: % Needed but Did Not Receive Help Coordinating Services for an Elderly or Disabled Person in the Past Year
