
Survey Methodology

- Random Digit Dialing (RDD) Telephone Survey methodology provides scientific validity
 - Population estimate
 - Produces the "purest" random sample
- 954) 435 ____ ___ ___
- RDD Telephone Survey(300 surveys)
- List Telephone Survey (900 surveys)
- Cell Phone Households with non-local area codes with DJNs based on billing zip codes
- 1,200interviews
- Response Rate (AAPOR RR3) is 39% and cooperation rate is 83%
- Weighting factors are used to combine the samples
- Interviews averaged about 22 minutes each
- Phones were dialed 121,477 times
- Interviewing April to June 2016



Sample Comparison Bar Chart






Percentage of Households in the Community **Who Are Jewish Households**




American Jewish Communities of 50,000+: 2016

(Number of Jews in Jewish Federation Service Areas)








Percentage of the Broward Population Living in Jewish Households 1940-2016










Distribution of Jewish Households








Place of Birth by Age of Adults






Country From Which Hispanic Jewish Adults Come












Location of Residence Prior to Broward

(Respondents in Jewish Full-Year Households)




Length of Residence in Broward (Respondents)




Average Number of New Households Per Year During the Past Five Years








Years at Current Address by Geographic Area



Expected Destination for Households Who Are Moving Within the Next Three Years




Migration of Full-Year Households

- Average Annual In-Migration
 - 900 full-year households moved in each year during the past five years
- Projected Average Annual Out-Migration
 - 400 full-year households definitely moving out of Broward each year during the next three years
 - 1,300 full-year households probably moving out of Broward each year during the next three years
- Projected Change
 - the Jewish population should continue to decrease in the next few years as a result of migration


Location of Adult Children Who Have Established Their Own Homes

(Households in Which the Respondent Is Age 50 or Over)







Age Distribution-All Americans - 2012





Age Distribution-Broward - 2016




Age Distribution by Geographic Area










Where Do the Children Live?

Age 0-17 (27,500 Children in Jewish Households)






Household Structure by Jewish Identification






Median Household Income

(Adjusted for inflation to 2015 dollars) (Jewish Households)




Median Household Income of Elderly Households

(Jewish Households with Persons Age 65 and Over) (Adjusted for inflation to 2015 dollars)






Changes in Jewish Identification, 1997-2016


Being Jewish Is Mainly a Matter of: (Jewish Respondents) Ancestry








Intermarriage (Couples Intermarriage Rate)




















Jewish Children Age 13-17 Who Currently Attend Formal Jewish Education









Need for Social Services in the Past Year










Households in Which a Jewish Child Age 6-17 Experienced Anti-Semitism in the Local Community in the Past Year




Perception of Anti-Semitism in Broward (Respondents)












Age of Households Who Donated to Jewish Federation in the Past Year










Donated to Non-Jewish Charities in the Past Year




Overlap Between Households Who Donated to Non-Jewish and Jewish Charities in the Past Year




