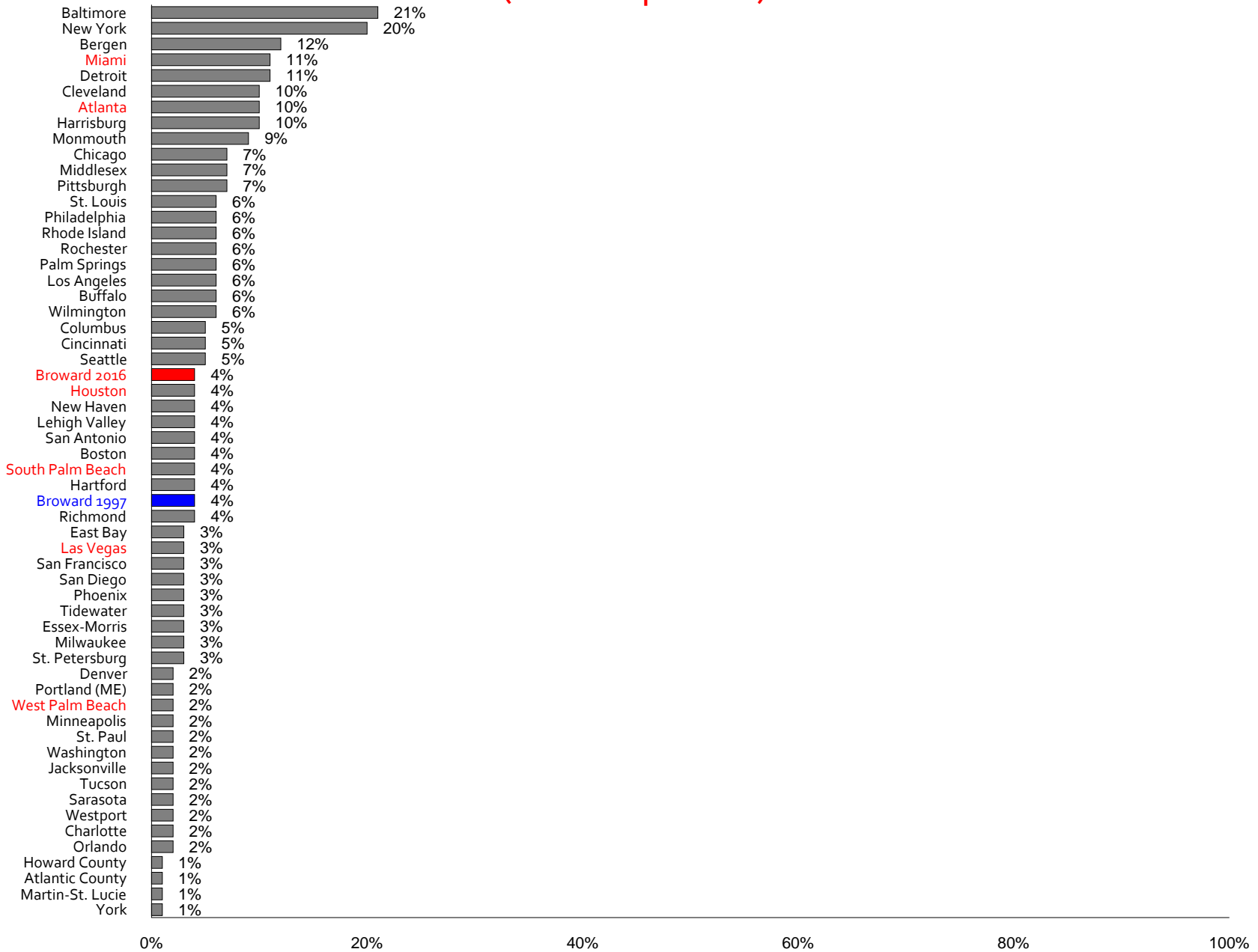
# Changes in Jewish Identification, 1997-2016

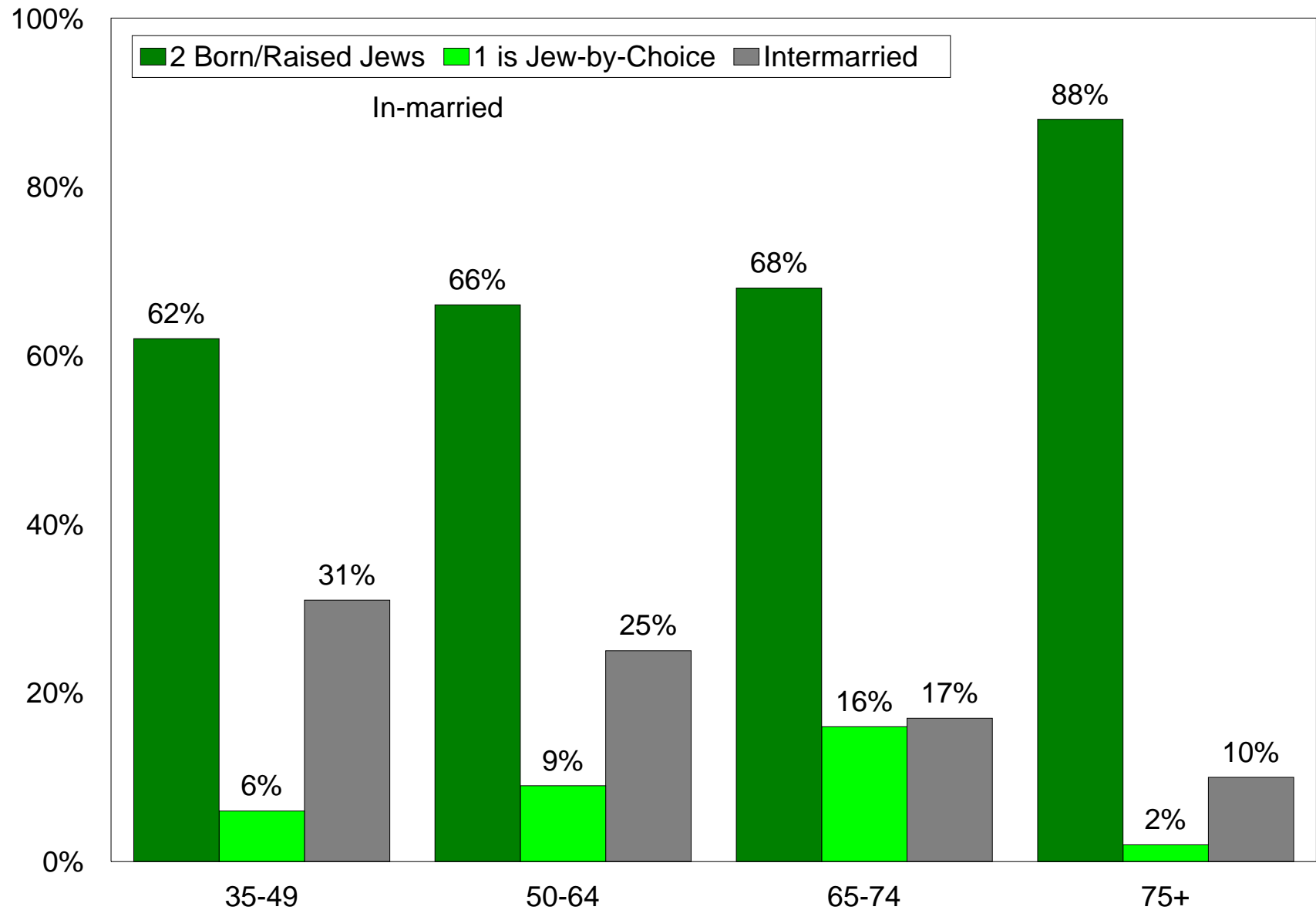

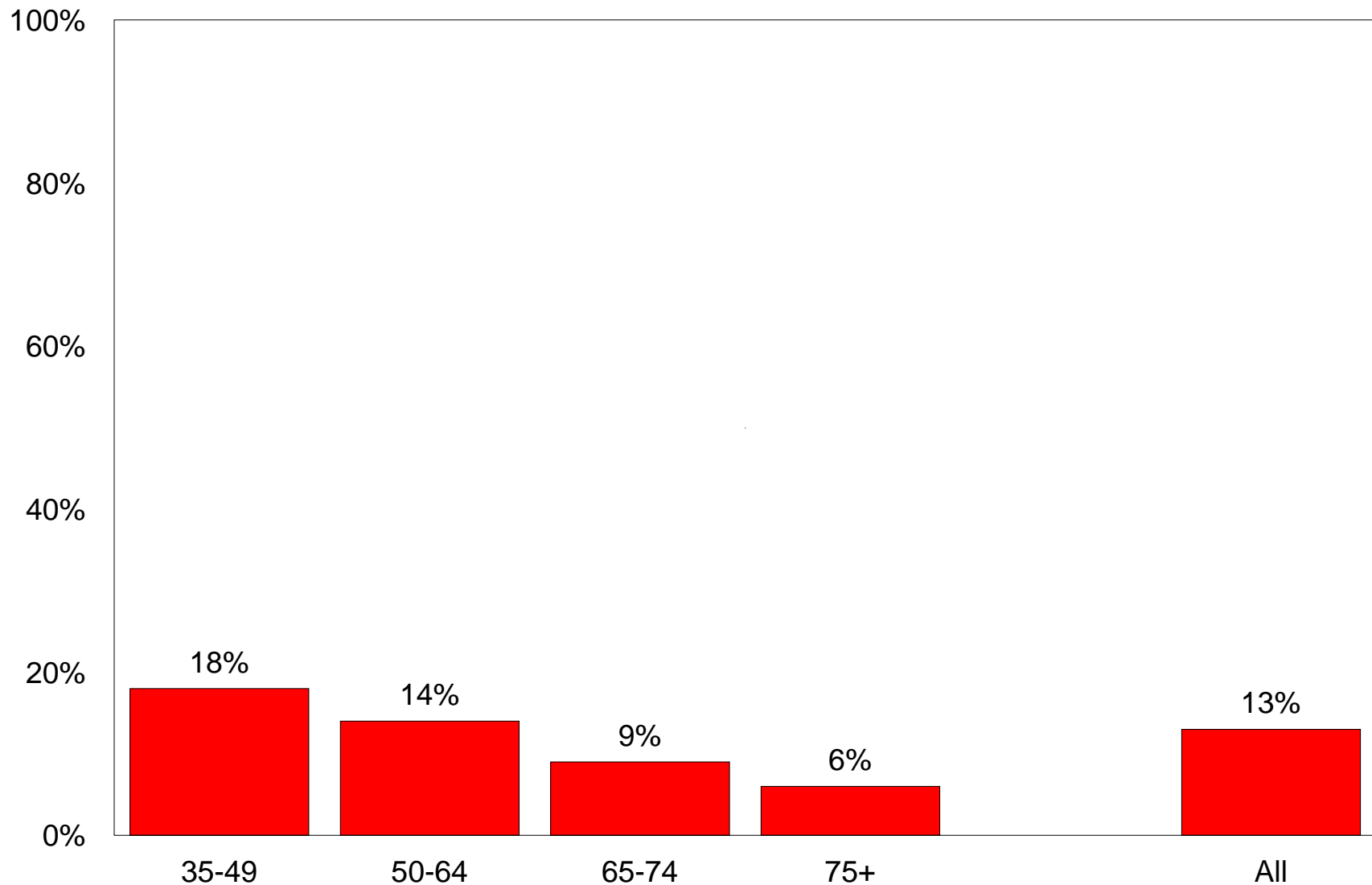

## Percentage of Married Jewish Persons Who Are Married to Non-Jews by Age

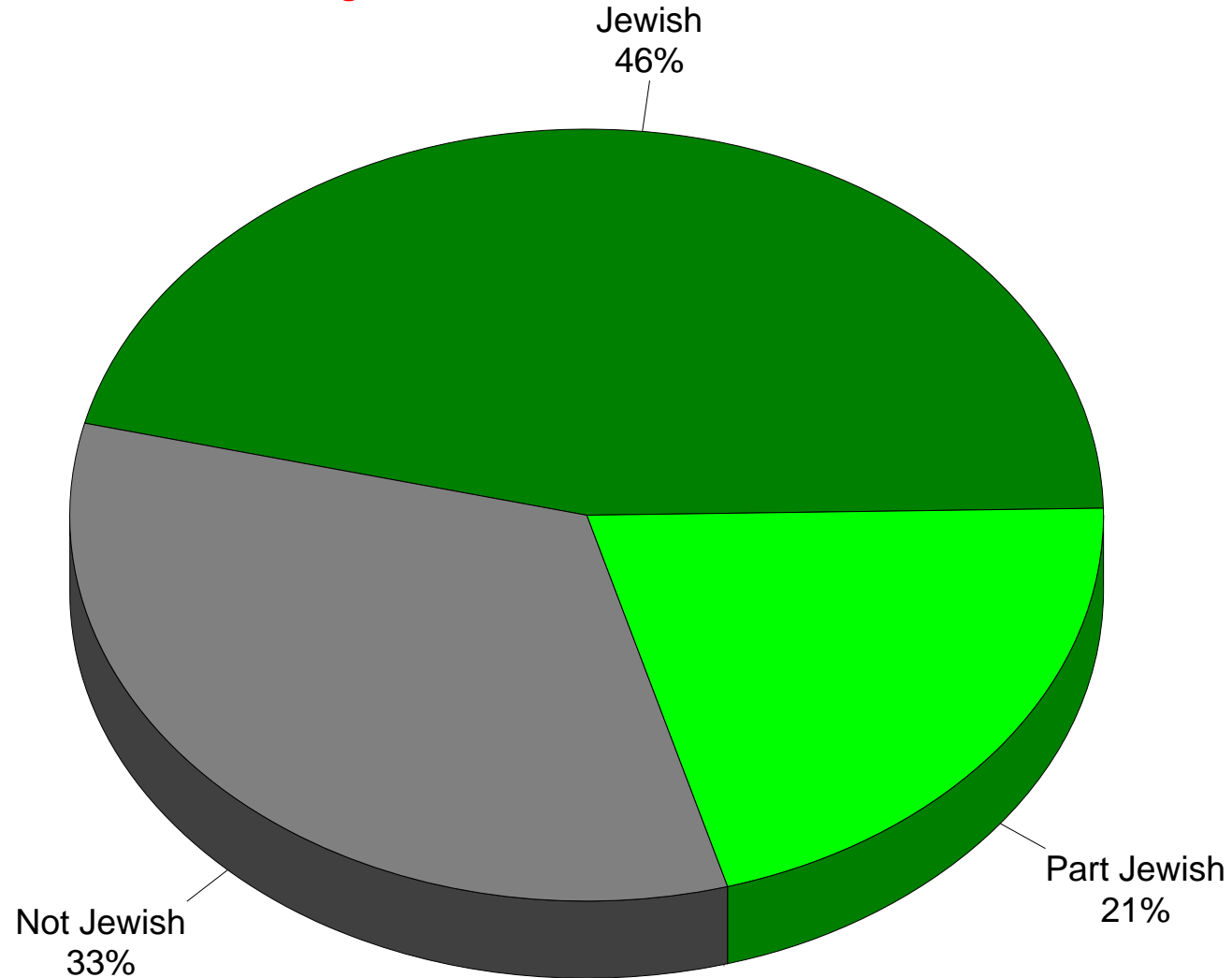

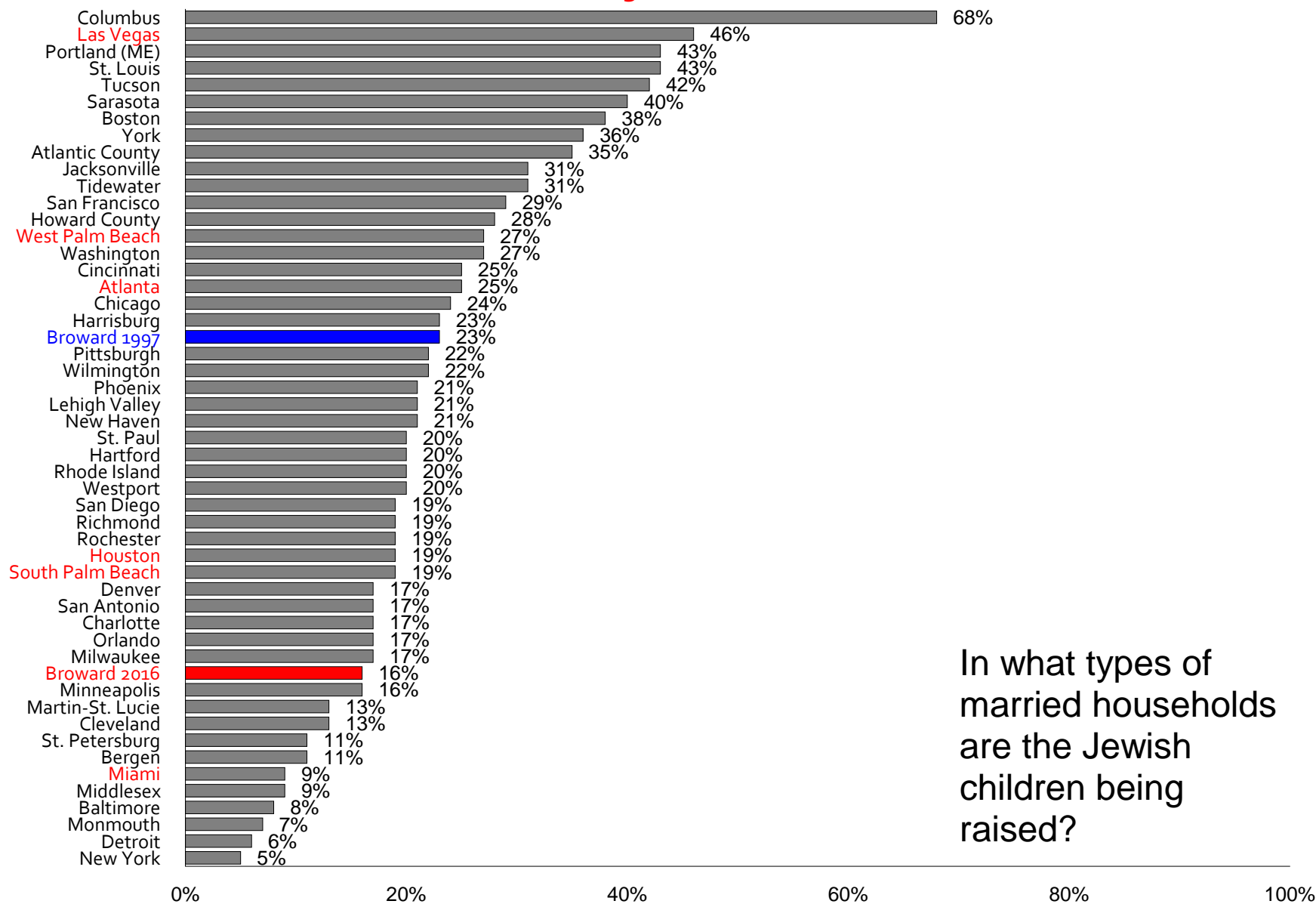

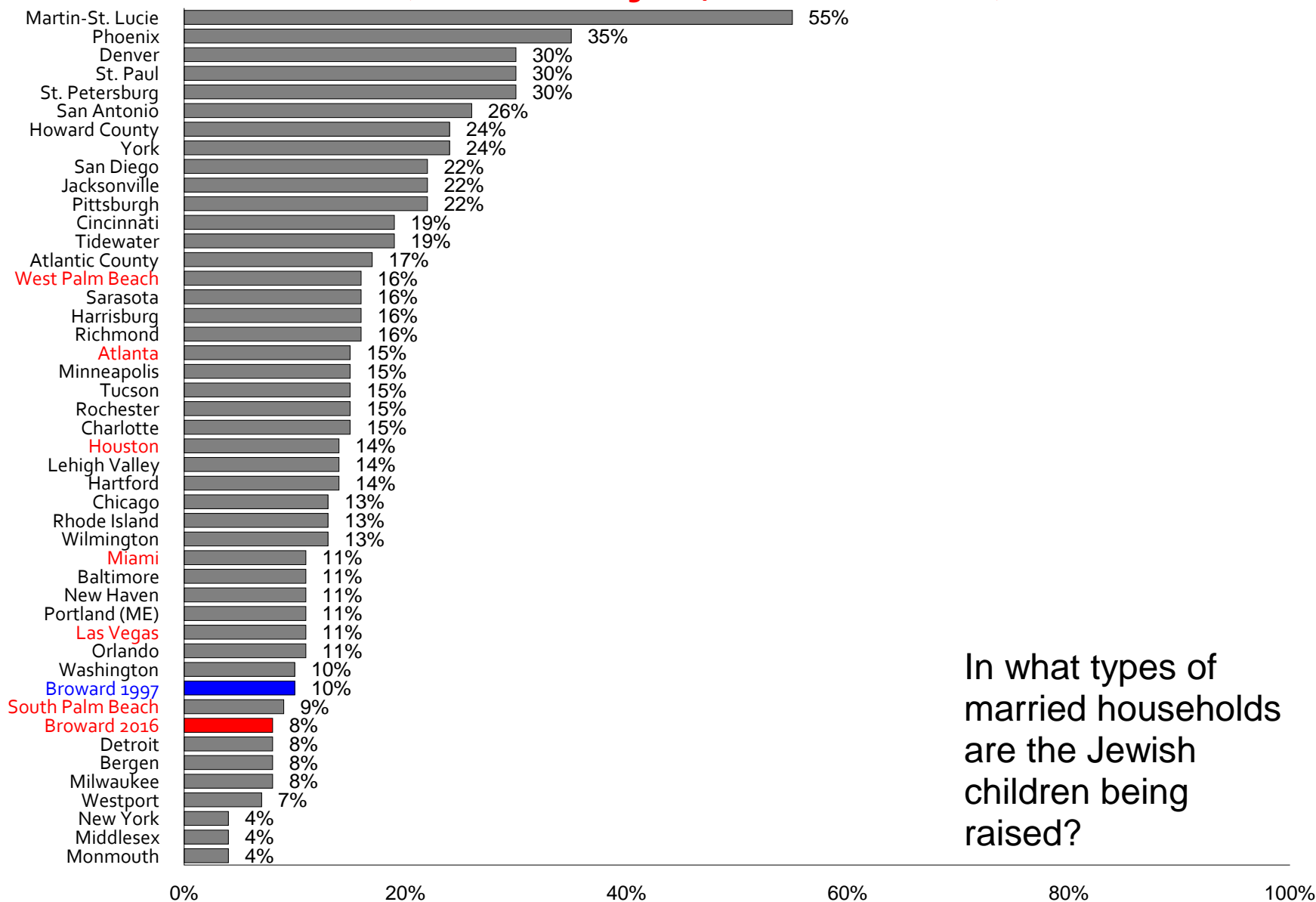
